

RESOLUTION NO. RES-16-0109

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF LONG BEACH APPROVING THE
APPLICATION(S) FOR GRANT FUNDS FROM THE LOS
ANGELES COUNTY REGIONAL PARK AND OPEN SPACE
DISTRICT FOR FOURTH SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT LOS
ANGELES COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FUNDING
FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF EIGHT (8) PARK PROJECTS
IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AND APPROVING THE
ADOPTION OF YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PLANS

WHEREAS, the people of the County of Los Angeles on November 3, 1992,
and on November 5, 1996 enacted Los Angeles County Proposition A, Safe
Neighborhood Parks, Gang Prevention, Tree-Planting, Senior and Youth Recreation,
Beach and Wildlife Protection (the "Propositions"), which among other uses, provides
funds to public agencies and nonprofit organizations in the County for the purpose of
acquiring and/or development facilities and open space for public recreation; and

WHEREAS, the Propositions also created the Los Angeles County
Regional Park and Open Space District (the "District") to administer said funds; and

WHEREAS, the District has set forth the necessary procedures governing
application for grant funds under the Propositions; and

WHEREAS, the District's procedures require the City of Long Beach to
certify, by resolution, the approval of the application before submission of said
application(s) to the District; and

WHEREAS, said application(s) contains assurances that the City of Long
Beach must comply with; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach certifies, through this resolution, that

1 the application(s) is approved for submission to the District; and

2 WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach will enter into an agreement(s) with the
3 District to provide funds for acquisition and development projects; and

4 WHEREAS, the District's procedures require the adoption of a Youth
5 Employment Plan for development projects by the governing body of the agency;

6 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
7 follows:

8 Section 1. Approves the filing of an application(s) with the Los Angeles
9 County Regional Park and Open Space District for funds for the following projects:

- 10 A. 14th Street Park Expansion;
11 B. Citywide Park Irrigation and Landscaping Improvements;
12 C. El Dorado Park West Duck Pond Restoration;
13 D. El Dorado Regional Park Restroom Rehabilitation;
14 E. Houghton Park ADA Improvements;
15 F. Stearns Champions Park Community Center Improvements;
16 G. Wrigley Greenbelt Trail; and
17 H. Red Car Greenway.

18 Section 2. Certifies that the City of Long Beach understands the
19 assurances and certification in the application form.

20 Section 3. Certifies that the City of Long Beach has, or will have,
21 sufficient funds to operate and maintain the projects in perpetuity.

22 Section 4. Certifies that the City of Long Beach will sign and return,
23 within thirty (30) days, both copies of the project agreement(s) sent by the District for
24 authorizing signature.

25 Section 5. Approves the adoption of a Youth Employment Plan for each
26 of the projects.

27 Section 6. Appoints the City Manager, or designee, to conduct all
28 negotiations, and to execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to,

1 applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests and so forth, which may be
2 necessary for the completion of the aforementioned projects.

3 Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
4 by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.

5 I hereby certify that the foregoing resolution was adopted by the City

FOURTH SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT EXCESS FUNDS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION OF PARK PROJECTS AND FUNDING AMOUNTS

PARK PROJECTS	FUNDING	PROJECT DESCRIPTION
14th Street Park Expansion	\$200,000	Demolition and site improvements for an expansion parcel of 14th Street Park. County funding is in addition to \$1,000,000 in FY 17 CDBG funding for Property Acquisition.
Citywide Irrigation & Landscaping Improvements	\$944,000	Park irrigation and landscaping improvements. County funding is in addition to \$350,000 in Measure A funding for planting, trimming, irrigation, and removal of trees Citywide; and \$350,000 in Measure A funding to repair/replace antiquated, inefficient irrigation systems Citywide.
El Dorado Park West Duck Pond Restoration	\$300,000	Restoration of the duck pond in El Dorado Park West, including dredging and reconfiguring the pond, upgrading the drainage and irrigation system, and habitat and site improvements. County funds are in addition to \$1,000,000 in City one-time funding.
El Dorado Regional Park Restroom Rehabilitation	\$250,000	New restroom finishes and furnishings in two restroom facilities at El Dorado Regional Park. No additional funding available.
Houghton Park ADA Improvements	\$300,000	ADA access improvements to park and community center entry, including relocating the picnic area, reconfiguring park entry and parking, and associated irrigation and landscape improvements. No additional funding available.
Stearns Champions Park Community Center Improvements	\$200,000	Repair water damage and the structural supports of the Stearns Champions Park Community Center roof. County funding is in addition to \$300,000 in emergency CIP funding.
Wrigley Greenbelt Trail	\$325,000	Development of an eight-acre greenbelt from 26 th to 34 th Streets made up of a decomposed granite multi-use trail, landscaping, amenities, and access. County funding is in addition to \$1,300,000 in previously secured County grant funding.
Red Car Greenway	\$81,000	Develop a new park on former Pacific Electric Right-of-Way railroad property from 4 th Street/Park Avenue to Ximeno Avenue, including a walking trail, landscape, and signage. County funding is in addition to \$800,000 of grant funding and \$69,000 of City one-time funds.
