Following her retirement from the City of Long Beach in 2009, Long Beach native Sharon Diggs-Jackson, relocated to Selma, AL with her husband Dr. David Jackson. Over the past four years, she has worked with the City of Selma to prepare for the upcoming 50th Anniversary celebrations. In November, Sharon released her book *Images of America: SELMA*, and a book presentation has been scheduled for Sunday, January 11, 2015. Included in the day is an opportunity to view the amazing photo exhibit, "A 1965 Voting Rights Retrospective." 

Images of America: SELMA

In 2015, Selma will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Voting Rights Movement, the Selma-to-Montgomery March and the passage of the Voting Rights Act. Preceding the celebrations of these historically and culturally significant events was the publication of *Images of America: Selma* by Sharon J. Jackson. "This book shows the beauty and uniqueness of Selma, and reminds us of the important role that Selma played in the development of our nation."

In more than 200 vintage images, many of which were donated by local residents and are previously unpublished, Selma showcases the cities earliest history, its famous residents and its role during the Civil War and Civil Rights Movement era.



Book Presentation

On January 11, 2015, Sharon will present a dynamic presentation of her book. Through stories, photos and songs you will learn how the struggle for voting rights touched the very soul of America, and forever changed the political landscape. Known as the 'people's movement', the Voting rights Movement shows how a small group of individuals nurtured and sustained the voting rights movement, which led to the passage of the 1965 Voting Rights Act.

• Jimmy Collier Music Presentation

Folk-rock singer Jimmy Collier, who performed freedom and gospel songs along the 54 mile Selma-to-Montgomery march, will give us a first-hand account of the march. As a member of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Collier was the opening act at rallies for Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. According to Jimmy, he never knew if he would be singing for 15 minutes or two hours. His job was to keep the crowds energized until Dr. King arrived. Collier has performed all over the world with artists such as Bob Dylan, Phil Ochs, Pete Seeger and Joan Baez.



Photo Exhibit

Included in the day is an opportunity to view the amazing photo exhibit, "A 1965 Voting Rights Retrospective." The exhibit features 50 moving images of the people who courageously marched for the right to vote, "Bloody Sunday", and the 54 mile Selma-to-Montgomery march. Most of these photographs have never been exhibited in Southern California.
