# Crime Statistics in Perspective

- 2014 – Lowest number of reported violent crimes in 42 years
- 2015 – Violent Crime increased / comparable to 2011 (record low at the time)
- Recent issues posing a challenge to increasing public safety
  - AB 109 / “Realignment”
  - Proposition 47
  - Decreased public appetite toward incarceration

## Part One Crime

- Uniform Crime Reporting System – Agencies report to state clearinghouse, states to FBI's UCR system
  - 8 crimes listed under part one
  - Occur with regularity across country
  - Most likely to be reported

## Part One Crime, cont.

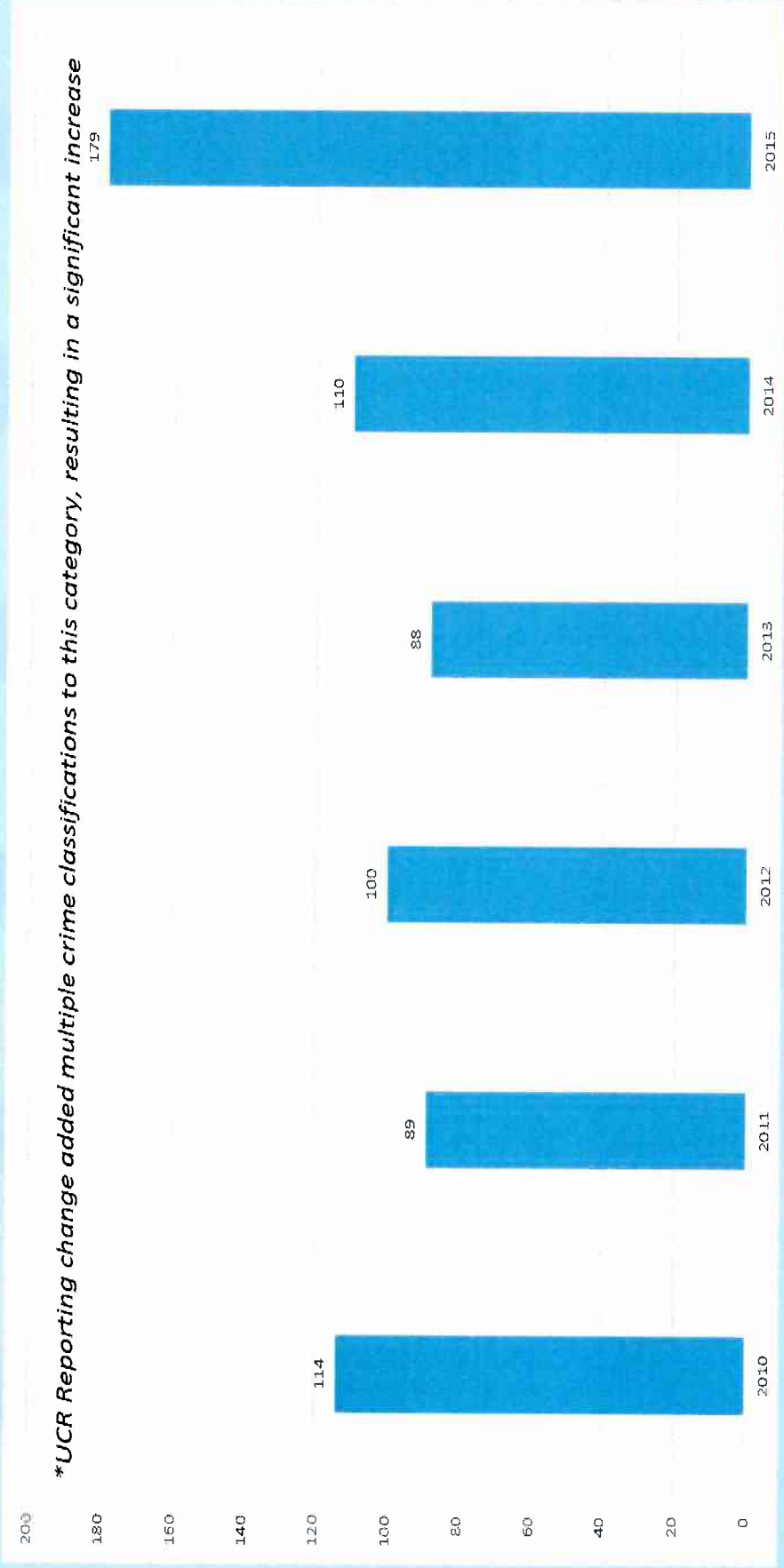
- 2015 saw a 15.9% increase in Part One crime compared to 2014
  - Recent media articles show this trend occurring across the country
  - Law Enforcement leaders have corroborated this at recent crime summits
- Aggravated Assaults, Auto Theft and Robbery are main contributors
- Violent Crime – up 18.8% compared to 2014
- Property Crime – up 15.4% compared to 2014



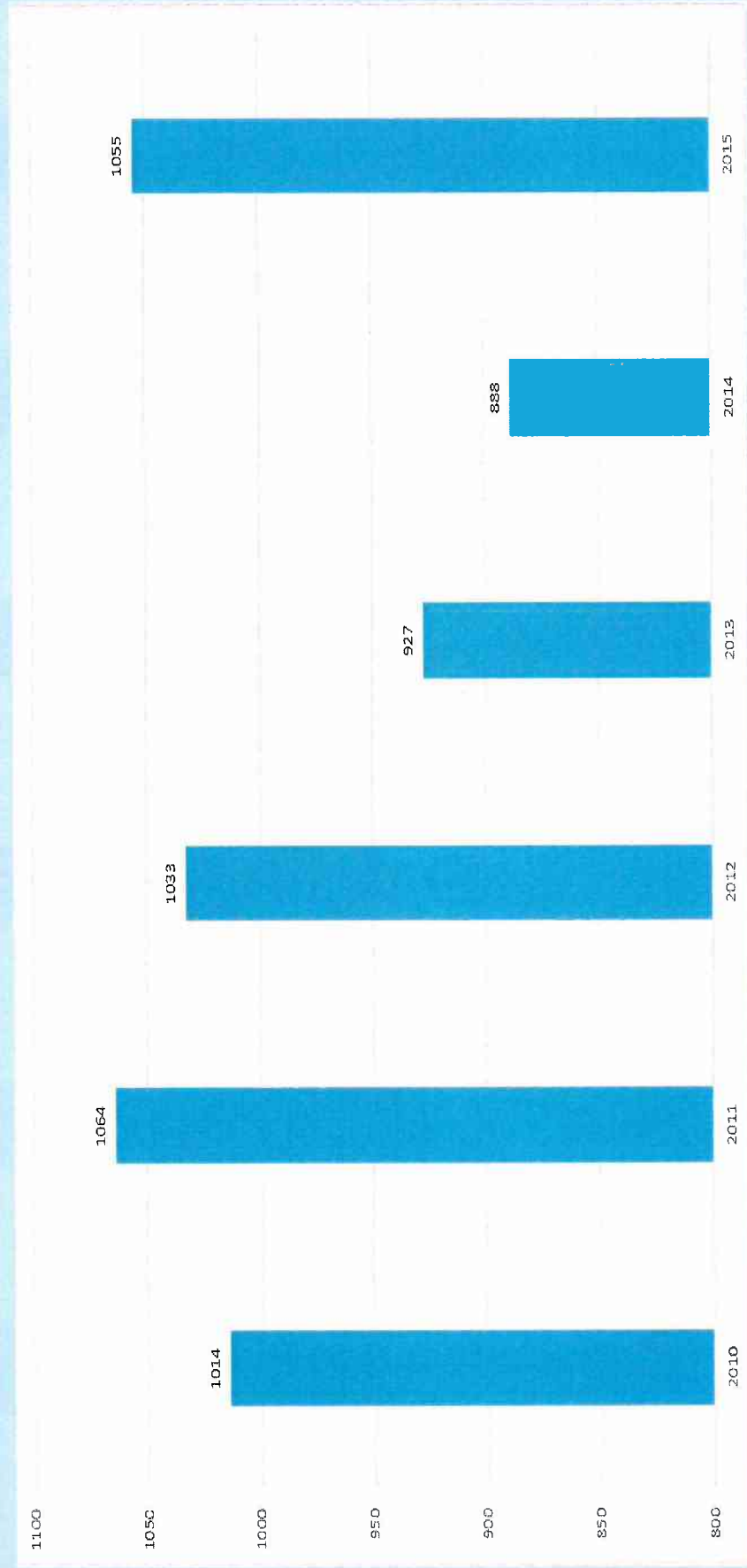

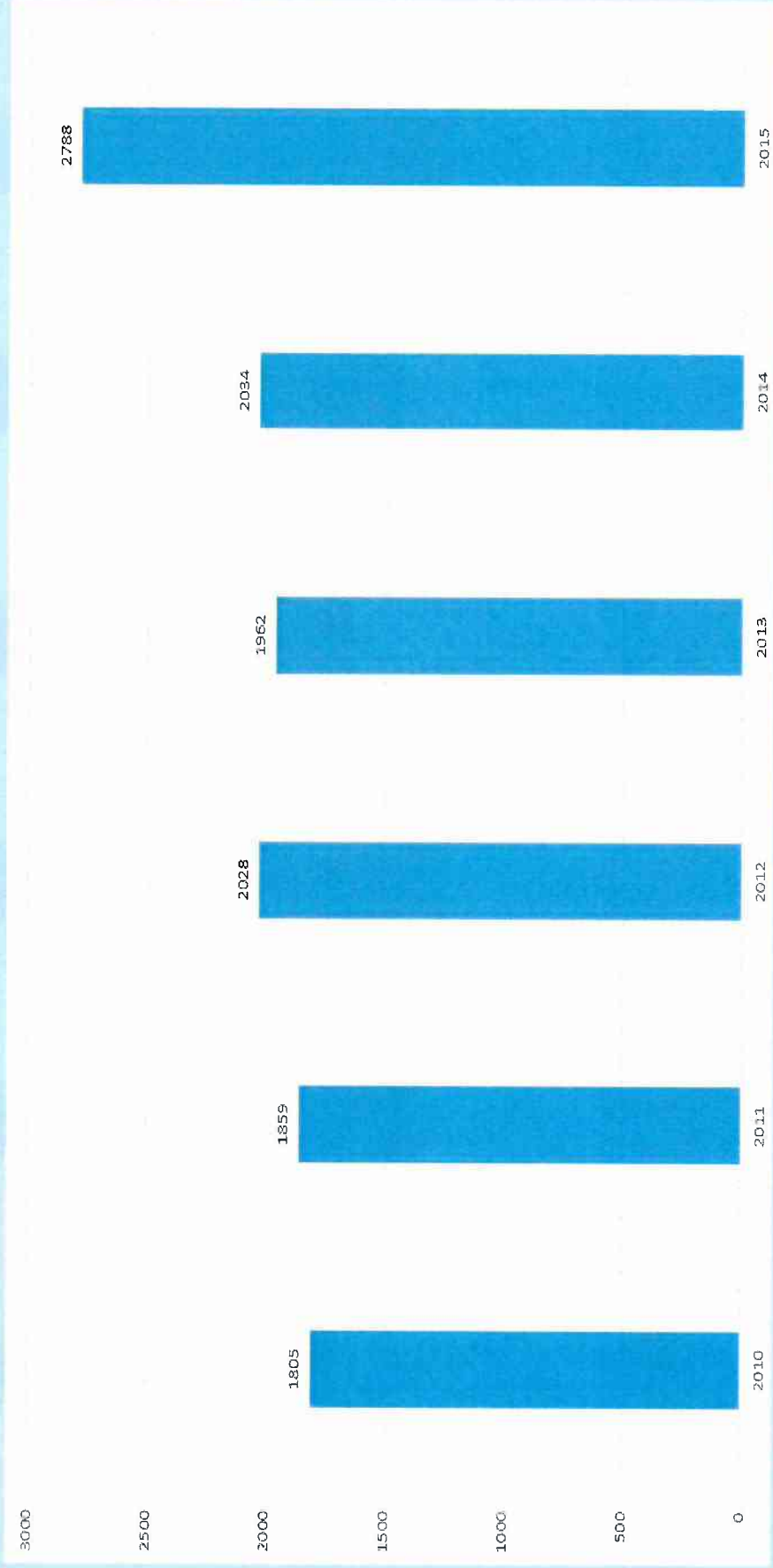

## What does this all mean?

- Part One is up – still comparable to crime levels seen in 2011
- Far lower than the record highs experienced in the early 1990's
- Proposition 47 and AB 109 – effects still yet to be quantified
- November Ballot initiative – change to CA constitution / parole
- PD continues to be data driven – effective deployment
- Education and outreach
- Technology



# Prohibited Possessors

- Persons who may not legally purchase/own/possess a firearm:
  - Felony conviction (Lifetime, unless expunged)
  - Certain misdemeanor convictions
    - ten year prohibition
  - Subject to a restraining order (Duration of the restraining order)
- Subjects typically notified in court for convictions of qualifying offenses
- Notified at time of service for restraining order
- Must properly remove firearms
  - PD
  - Sell through licensed federal firearms dealer
  - Transfer ownership through licensed federal firearms dealer

## Prohibited Possessors in Long Beach

- 250 – 350 currently in system – This is always an estimate
- Budgeted detectives in years past – case by case basis now
- Past partnerships with DOJ
