HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached amended and restated Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to submit an application to the Clean Beaches Initiative (CBI) Grant Program. (Districts 2 and 3)

DISCUSSION

The California State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) CBI Grant Program provides funding for projects that restore and protect the water quality and environment of coastal waters, estuaries, bays, and near shore waters. On November 16, 2012, the SWRCB informed City staff that the Conceptual Proposal for stormwater low-flow diversion, which was submitted in September 2012, qualified for the Implementation Round 1 of the CBI Grant Program. An invitation to submit a detailed application for funding was extended to the City. In addition to the invitation, the SWRCB assigned a Grant Manager to assist staff with the City's project.

On March 12, 2013, the City Council adopted a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to submit an application, accept up to \$4,470,627 in grant funds from the SWRCB, if the City is awarded the funding, and to execute all documents, agreements and amendments necessary to accept the funds (attached).

The SWRCB has requested that Resolution No. RES-13-0025 be amended and restated to conform to their requirements. The amended and restated Resolution affirms that the City of Long Beach will operate and maintain the Project for a minimum period of twenty (20) years after completion of the Project and appoints the City Manager, or his designee, to execute and submit all documents, including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments, and payment requests, which may be necessary for the completion of the project.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Amy R. Webber on June 18, 2013 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on June 28, 2013.

SUSTAINABILITY

The project will restore and protect the recreational water quality of the City's beaches. Educational features would be incorporated along the beach outfall structures to inform the public of the consequences of trash and bacteria in sediment that enter the storm drains. The benefits of having clean water on City beaches would also be highlighted in the educational features. Clean water would attract more beach goers to enjoy recreational beach activities.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on July 23, 2013, as grant funds will be committed to projects based on the timely submittal of completed applications.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no change to the potential grant amount. If successful, the City will receive up to \$4,470,627 in grant funding from the SWRCB, with a match up to \$496,736, including staff time, from the Tidelands Operations Fund (TF 401). An appropriation increase will be requested when the grant is awarded and prior to initiating the project. Following completion in FY 16, the annual operating and maintenance cost is estimated to be \$50,000 and will be supported by TF 401 for a minimum of 20 years. If needed, the Department will request an appropriating increase for these additional costs

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to submit an application to the Clean Beaches Initiative (CBI) Grant Program; and

Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to accept a grant from the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) for \$4,470,627, if the City is awarded funding, and execute all documents, agreements and amendments necessary to accept the funds. (Districts 2,3)

DISCUSSION

The California SWRCB CBI Grant Program provides funding for projects that restore and protect the water quality and environment of coastal waters, estuaries, bays, and near shore waters. On November 16, 2012, the SWRCB informed City staff that the Conceptual Proposal for stormwater low-flow diversion, which was submitted in September 2012, qualified for the Implementation Round 1 of the CBI Grant Program. An invitation to submit a detailed application for funding was extended to the City. In addition to the invitation, the SWRCB assigned a Grant Manager to assist staff with the City's project. The SWRCB has assigned Proposal Number 24663 to the project.

A resolution has been prepared and attached that authorizes the City Manager, or his designee, to apply for and accept up to \$4,470,627 for CBI Grant Program funds. If the City is awarded funding, the funds will be used to construct structural Best Management Practice (BMP) devices consisting of three Low Flow Diversion (LFD) Systems and two Vortex Separation System (VSS) pre-filter devices that will affect three beach outfalls, in order to achieve compliance with the reduction or elimination of bacteria, as required by the Long Beach Beaches and Los Angeles River Estuary Bacteria TMDL, adopted by the SWRCB in March 2012.

The proposed structural BMPs will be constructed in the storm-drain main lines that discharge to the following beach outfalls (see attached):

1. 9th Place south of Ocean Boulevard (construct one LFD and one VSS)

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- 2. Redondo Avenue north of Ocean Boulevard (construct one LFD and one VSS)
- 3. Shoreline Avenue at Golden Avenue (construct one LFD)

The locations above have produced the highest levels of bacteria among the City's five beach outfalls. It is hoped that future funding will become available to construct LFD Systems and VSS pre-filter devices in the remaining two beach outfalls.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Amy R. Webber on January 28, 2013 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on February 13, 2013.

SUSTAINABILITY

The project will restore and protect the recreational water quality of the City's beaches. Educational features would be incorporated along the beach outfall structures to inform the public of the consequences of trash and bacteria in sediment that enter the storm drains. The benefits of having clean water on City beaches would also be highlighted in the educational features. Cleaner water would attract more beach goers to enjoy recreational beach activities.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on March 12, 2013, as grant funds will be committed to projects based on the timely submittal of completed applications.

FISCAL IMPACT

Total project costs, including staff time, are anticipated to be \$4,967,363. If successful, the City will receive up to \$4,470,627 in grant funding from the State Water Resources Control Board, with a match of up to \$496,736, including staff time, from the Tidelands Operations Fund (TF 401). An appropriation increase will be requested prior to initiating the project.

Following the projected completion date in FY 2016, staff estimates a total of \$50,000 in annual operating and maintenance costs. Potential ongoing costs include an annual permit fee from the Sanitation District of Los Angeles County and utilities. These costs will be supported by the Tidelands Operations Fund (TF 401) and, if needed, the Department will request an increase of appropriation for these additional costs as part of the proposed budget process. Approval of this recommendation will provide continued support to the local economy.



WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach affirms that it will operate and maintain the Project for a minimum period of twenty (20) years after completion of the Project;
