FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT NO. 35720

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT NO. 35720 is made and entered, in duplicate, as of August 30, 2021 for reference purposes only, pursuant to a minute order adopted by the City Council of the City of Long Beach at its meeting on August 24, 2021, by and between UNITE USA INC., a Delaware corporation ("Consultant"), with a place of business at 217 Broadway, Floor 8, New York, NY 10007, and the CITY OF LONG BEACH, a municipal corporation ("City").

WHEREAS, City desires to expand the Older Adult Resource Line to provide support to any resident of Long Beach who is in need of finding resources such as food, mental health supports, rental assistance, etc. This expanded line will be known as the "LB Resource Line" and will build off the success of the Older Adult Resource Line; and

WHEREAS, City and Consultant (the "Parties") entered into Agreement No. 35720 (the "Agreement") whereby Consultant agreed to provide these services; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to increase the contract amount by Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$14,500), for a new contract amount of One Hundred Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$109,500), and update the Scope of Work;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, and conditions herein contained, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Section B. of the Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows.

"Contractor shall sell, furnish and deliver to the City the same type and kind of service purchased under the Houston Contract, except as modified by Exhibit "B-1" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, in an annual amount not to exceed One Hundred Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$109,500), including tax and fees. To the extent that the Houston Contract and this Agreement are inconsistent, the following priority shall govern: (1) this Agreement and (2) the Houston Contract."

2. Exhibit "B" to Agreement 35720 is hereby amended and replaced with Exhibit "B-1", attached hereto and incorporated herein.
