# Landscape Standards

- Defines how a landscaped area is expected to look and function when the work is completed
  - Consistent with performance criteria
  - Aligned with the Department's strategic objectives
  - Has short- and long-term expectations
  - Consideration to:
    - Stakeholder Use
    - Horticultural Function and Aesthetics
    - Safety
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# Scope

## Horticultural Elements

- Trees
- Lawns
- Lakes
- Synthetic and Natural Turf Athletic Fields
- Nature Centers
- Open Spaces
- Drought-Tolerant Plants

## Functional Elements

- Sidewalks
- Parking Lots
- Picnic Tables and Benches
- Waste Receptacles
- Play Structures
- Dog Parks
- Historic Site (Rancho)

# Procedure for Awarding

- 2016 revision of contract began
  - Preparation of the Request For Proposals (RFP)
    - Grounds Maintenance committee produced the document with input and contract samples from CA cities with similar landscape scopes
    - Included recommendations in City Auditor's 2016 Park Maintenance Audit
- Criteria for award
  - Approach, Experience, Price

# What's Different Now?

## ➤ Irrigation

- Repairs are to be performed within 12 hours of discovery
- Majority of irrigation timers will be programmed by 2019

## ➤ Athletic fields are to be inspected daily, fertilized monthly, and irrigation repair completed within 4 hours

## ➤ Earlier 'permit' site preparation (7 am vs. 9 am) for weekend use

## ➤ Specifications for trash, abandoned items, and debris removal more clearly defined

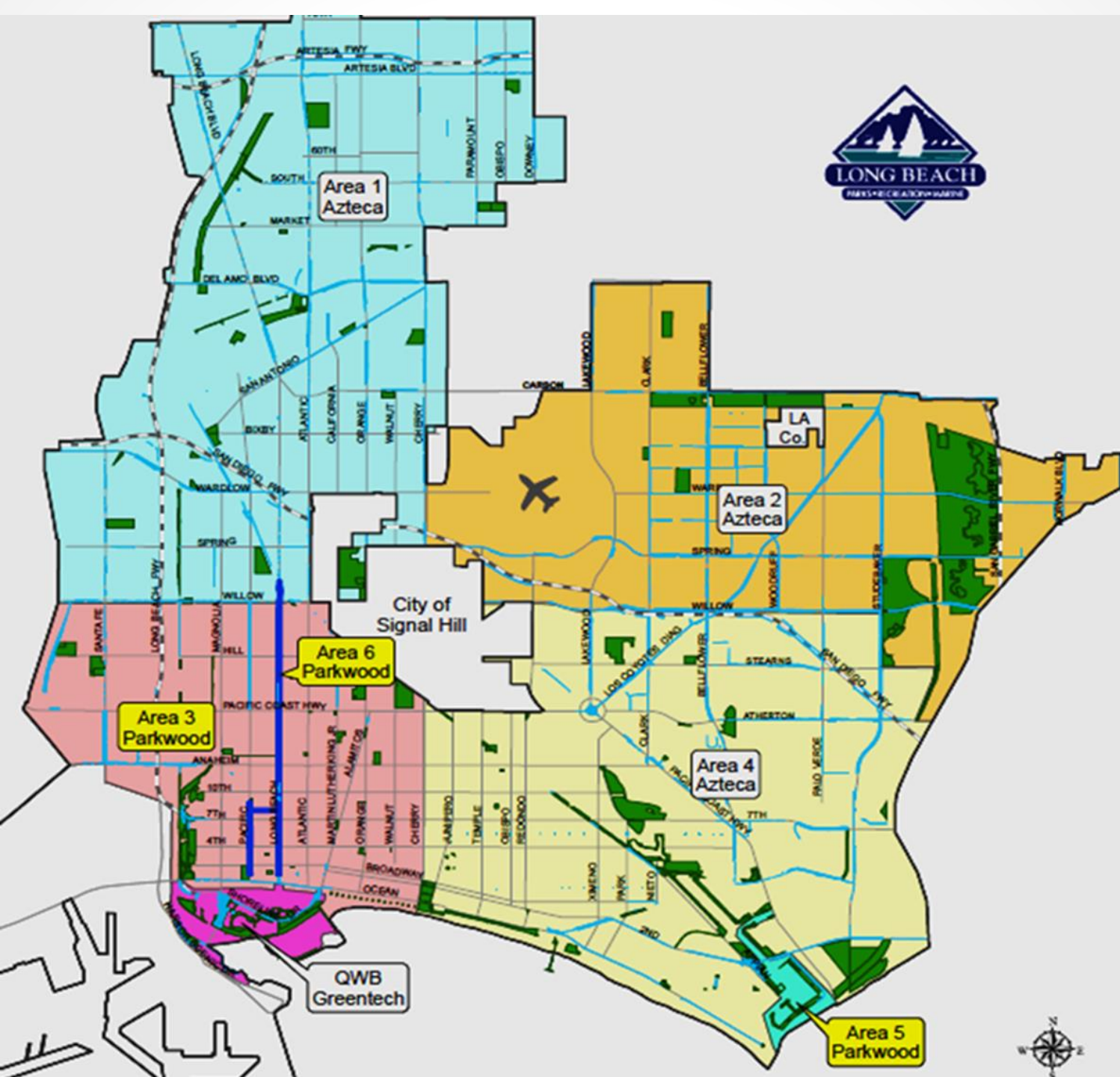
## ➤ Management includes weekly park inspections against the prescribed specifications using a mobile inspection system

- Deficiencies will result in reductions in payment of invoices

# Results

Landscape contract consists of the same primary geographical areas, but are now managed as 6 individual entities, instead of 4

- Areas 1-4 remain the same
- Area 5 consists of Tidelands basins, which required a specified landscape scope
- Area 6, MTA Blue line, was formerly managed within Area 3

- Contract cost is 5.1 million
  - 1 million more than previous contract
  - Funds service levels for all sites:
    - Parks
    - Libraries
    - Street landscape
    - Police stations
    - Health centers
    - Lakes
    - Historic site
    - Natural areas - El Dorado Nature Center and DeForest Wetlands

# Contract Management

Site evaluation and communication are the most important component of managing a scope of this magnitude.

- Electronic mobile monitoring system developed in 2016 and operationally employed since 2017
  - Allows for inspection of all sites, against the contracted landscape specification
  - Inspection document has the landscape contract specifications listed
  - Work orders are issued immediately against deficiencies found during the inspection
  - Ongoing deficiencies result in a reduction against the monthly income



# Transition

- September start date
- Transition team consist of both Tidelands and Uplands Maintenance Superintendents and supervisors, and Contractors' representatives
- City and contractor transition teams have met:
  - Site tours are scheduled for areas that will have a new contractor
  - Current service schedules have been reviewed and made available
  - Equipment and staffing is being addressed by the contractor
  - Maintenance yards are being readied for turnover
  - Additional monitoring from City staff is planned for initial operations



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
