# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RECOGNIZING HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS, from September 15, 2006, through October 15, 2006, the country celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month; and

WHEREAS, the presence of Hispanics on this continent predates the founding of our Nation, and, as among the first to settle in the New World, Hispanics and their descendants have had a profound and lasting influence on American history, values, and culture; and

WHEREAS, since the arrival of the earliest Spanish settlers more than 400 years ago, millions of Hispanic men and women have come to the United States from Mexico, Puerto Rico, Cuba, El Salvador and other Caribbean regions, Central America, South America, and Spain, in search of freedom, peace, and opportunity; and

WHEREAS, Hispanic Americans have contributed throughout the ages to the prosperity and culture of our nation; and

WHEREAS, the United States Census Bureau now lists Hispanic Americans as the largest ethnic minority within the United States; and

WHEREAS, the State of California is the state with the largest Hispanic population in the United States as reported in the 2000 U.S. Census, and that an estimated one-third of its total population is of Hispanic descent; and

WHEREAS, Hispanic Americans comprise a plurality of the residents living in the City of Long Beach, contributing to our distinction as the most diverse city in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Hispanic Americans are dedicated public servants, honorably elected to serve as representatives to the local, state and federal levels of government;
