## **Senior Police Partners Request for Application**

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The pre-placement application process for volunteers is required of all volunteer applicants and consists of a comprehensive background investigation which includes Live Scan fingerprinting, a motor vehicle inquiry check, credit check, polygraph, and personal and criminal history check. At this time, the application/background process can take four months or more to complete. Additionally, Senior Police Partners must successfully complete a 40-hour Senior Police Partner Academy that will take place in early 2017.

Once you have successfully completed the background investigation process, the Chief of Police will make final approval. The final approval by the Chief of Police, gives the Volunteer Coordinator the go-ahead to assign the newly approved volunteer a City Identification Card and placement in an assignment within the Department until successful completion of the Senior Police Partner Academy.
