## A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH DESIGNATING 2010 AS THE YEAR OF NO TEXTING WHILE DRIVING

WHEREAS, THE City of Long Beach fully supports the no texting while driving ban in the State of California and the new public awareness and education campaign launched by AT&T; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach promotes the health and safety of all Long Beach residents; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach views texting while driving as a seriously dangerous and deadly distraction; and

WHEREAS, according to Time magazine "National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) study that identified the cell phone as a serious safety hazard when used on the road"; and

WHEREAS, ArticlesBase wrote that every day in 2008, over 800,000 people were using a mobile phone, texting, or calling while driving in the United States, making wireless devices the No. 1 source of driver inattention; and

WHEREAS, California passed a law in 2008 that made it illegal to talk on your cell phone while driving, unless the driver has a hands-free device; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2008, Chatsworth, California experienced a horrible and deadly train crash when the engineer viewed a text message, as a result 25 people died and more than 100 were injured; and

WHEREAS, texting is considered riskier than driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs according to the Transport Research Laboratory; and

WHEREAS, Edgar Snyder & Associates reported that well over 6,000

Americans have lost their lives due to cell phone use by texting or making or receiving
