# Introduction

Over 12,000 parolees in California institutions are returning to communities or homeless shelters within the County and City of Los Angeles. Whether it's a few weeks later or after many years, parolees find their neighborhoods no better prepared to address their critical employment, health, and housing issues than when they were incarcerated.

With no formal mechanism linking job creation, training, and job placement efforts to the neediest job seekers enrolled in City and County funded human service programs, women and men who leave prison with no direct access to specialized programs tend to subsist on the margins of their communities. The South Los Angeles area alone has 5,262 parolees, with these neighborhoods primarily housing low-income residents. With a state recidivism rate of 64%, the intense cycle of arrest, removal, incarceration, and re-entry—at levels four times higher than 20 years ago—has had severe consequences to the neighborhoods.

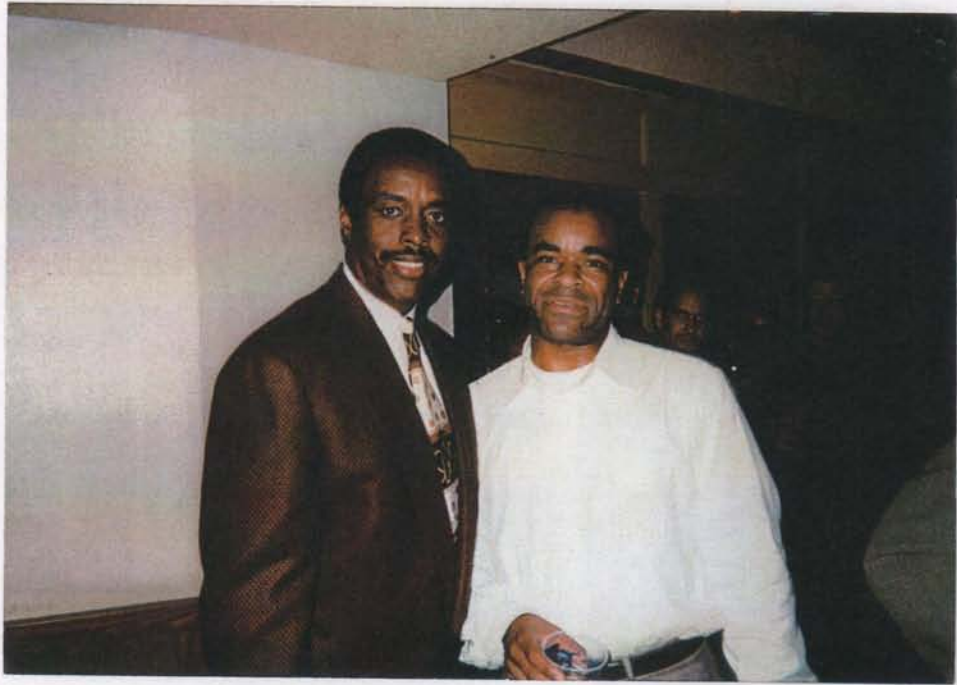

**Long Beach man pleads not guilty to shooting code enforcement officer, holding police at bay**

LONG BEACH — A man accused of shooting a Long Beach code enforcement officer in the face and then holding police at bay for nearly seven hours pleaded not guilty Wednesday to attempted murder and other charges.

Anthony Glen Gorospe, 51, of Long Beach, was charged July 9 with one count each of attempted murder and possession of a firearm by a felon, three counts of attempted murder of a peace officer and five counts each of assault on a peace officer with a semiautomatic firearm and assault with a semiautomatic firearm.

He is accused of shooting the inspector around 8 a.m. July 5 at his home in the 6100 block of John Avenue. Officers evacuated some neighbors from the area as they tried to coax the man into surrendering.

He was taken into custody in his yard around 2:40 p.m. after a police dog was sent in.

Long Beach police Chief Jim McDonnell said the suspect fired more shots during the standoff, but no other injuries were reported. A ballistic tactical vehicle was sent into the residence, along with several canisters of tear gas, but the suspect fired more shots and repeatedly yelled out for officers to shoot him, police said.

Neighbors said the man had lived in the home for years with his mother, who recently died.

McDonnell said code enforcement workers were trying to serve an inspection warrant at the home, which has been the subject of code violations for years.

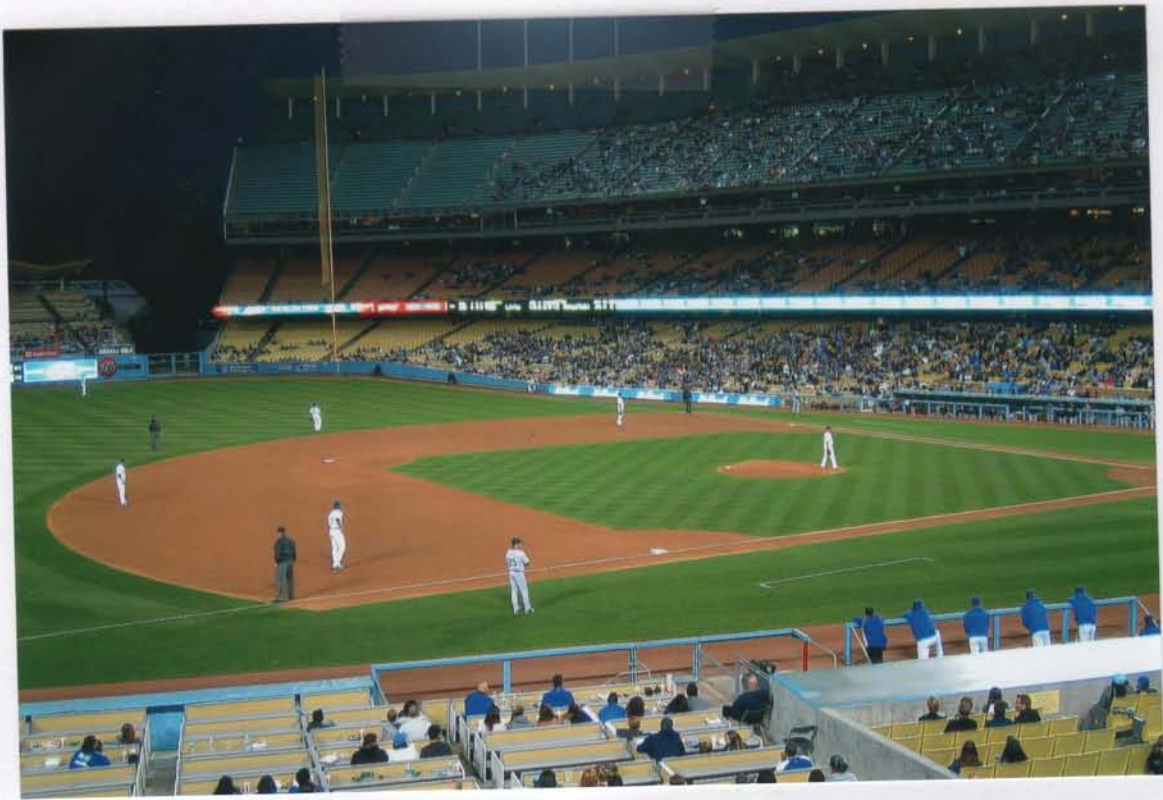

Hill, a former NFL football player, combines his talents as a broadcaster and his experier playing field as well as his relationships as a reporter to produce precise sports coverage weeknight.

Hill is active with several community and sports fitness organizations. Most recently, He is member of the board of directors of the Los Angeles Urban League. He is also a membe of directors for the Grossman Burns Center in Sherman Oaks. Hill is also on the advisory Boy Scouts of America.

He currently serves as the official spokesperson for the City of Los Angeles Department and Parks. In this honorary role, Hill works with the office of the Mayor and the Departme Recreation and Parks in numerous youth outreach and sports fitness programs.
