


Over 12,000 parolees in California institutions are returning to communities or homeless shelters within the County and City of Los Angeles. Whether it's a few weeks later or after many years, parolees find their neighborhoods no better prepared to address their critical employment, health, and housing issues than when they were incarcerated.

With no formal mechanism linking job creation, training, and job placement efforts to the neediest job seekers enrolled in City and County funded human service programs, women and men who leave prison with no direct access to specialized programs tend to subsist on the margins of their communities. The South Los Angeles area alone has 5,262 parolees, with these neighborhoods primarily housing low-income residents. With a state recidivism rate of 64%, the intense cycle of arrest, removal, incarceration, and re-entry—at levels four times higher than 20 years ago—has had severe consequences to the neighborhoods.



He was taken into custody in his yard around 2:40 p.m. after a police dog was sent in.

Long Beach police Chief Jim McDonnell said the suspect fired more shots during the standoff, but no other injuries were reported. A ballistic tactical vehicle was sent into the residence, along with several

canisters of tear gas, but the suspect fired more shots and repeatedly yelled out for officers to shoot him, police said.



Jim Hill, CBS 2 Sports Director, rejoined the CBS 2 in March, 1992. Hill reports on CBS 2 News weekd and 11 p.m. In addition, he hosts the Sunday Night at 11:15 p.m.

Hill, a former NFL football player, combines his talents as a broadcaster and his experier playing field as well as his relationships as a reporter to produce precise sports coverage weeknight.

Hill feels at home in the studios of CBS 2, where he was sportscaster for 11 years, from 1987. Prior to returning to CBS 2 in 1992, Hill spent four years with KABC-TV, Los Angel

Hill, an award-winning broadcaster, has been honored with the 1994 Associated Press "E Sportscast" trophy for Action News Sports at 5 p.m. In addition, he has been honored wit for Best Sportscast and Best Reporting from the Los Angeles Press Club. He has receive awards for Best Sports from the California Associated Press Television and Radio Assoc been awarded an Emmy, and a nomination from the Academy of Television Arts and Scialso received "Best Sports Reporting" award from United Press International (UPI).

Polls conducted by local newspapers over the years have named Hill the top Southern C sportscaster. Additionally, Hill was highlighted as tops in Los Angeles by the national nev Today.

Hill is active with several community and sports fitness organizations. Most recently, He is member of the board of directors of the Los Angeles Urban League. He is also a member of directors for the Grossman Burns Center in Sherman Oaks. Hill is also on the advisory Boy Scouts of America.

He currently serves as the official spokesperson for the City of Los Angeles Department and Parks. In this honorary role, Hill works with the office of the Mayor and the Departme Recreation and Parks in numerous youth outreach and sports fitness programs.
