It recommended "training" on 44 allegations, which, given the city manager's pattern of discretion as evident in his own CPCC reports, were most likely thrown out without justification. The rest of the cases, not properly reviewed by the CPCC, were closed due to "insufficient evidence, lack of witness cooperation or staff's recommendation."

Police departments are notoriously biased and unreliable investigators of themselves and your approval of the destruction of these public records not only places you in collusion with the Long Beach Police Department's longstanding negligence and patterns of abuse but it spits in the face of last week's action by giving the LBPD power to sweep their decisions under the rug without any meaningful reflection and commitment to changes that can come from that.

The rest of the cases, not properly reviewed by the CPCC, were closed due to "insufficient evidence, lack of witness cooperation or staff's recommendation."

Your approval of the destruction of these public records that have not gone through the proper channels of investigation and oversight not only places you in collusion with the Long Beach Police Department's longstanding negligence and patterns of abuse; you give them the power to sweep it under the rug without any true, meaningful reflection and the changes that can come from that.

Do you see the issue here? You promise transparency, then turn around and try to destroy evidence that may incriminate the police department of the many cases of police misconduct that our community members have shared in their vulnerability. How do you expect to “reconcile” our trust in the police, and you, our district representatives, by stamping on the very last vestige of public trust in this system? Your approval of this item will, without a doubt, destroy all hope of having a reconciliation process with any integrity.

We demand that you immediately remove this item from the June 16 city council agenda. We are watching your actions very closely.
