RESOLUTION NO. RES-22-0056

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION'S OFFICE OF GRANTS AND LOCAL SERVICES FOR THE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND PROGRAM FOR THE EL DORADO DUCK POND RESTORATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Congress under Public Law 88-578 has authorized the establishment of a Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant-In-Aid Program ("Program"), providing matching funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for acquiring lands and developing facilities for public outdoor recreation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the California Department of Parks and Recreation is responsible for administration of the program in the State, setting up necessary rules and procedures governing applications by local agencies under the Program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach desires to submit an Application for the State's Program for its proposed El Dorado Duck Pond Restoration Project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach ("City" or "Applicant") certifies by this resolution the approval of the City's application for grant funds in the amount of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) and the availability of fifty-percent of total eligible matching funds prior to submission of the Application to the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. City approves the filing of an Application for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance for the proposed Project.

Section 2. City agrees to abide by Section 6(f)(3) of Public Law 88-578

which states "No property acquired or developed with assistance under this section shall, without the approval of the National Secretary of the Interior, be converted to other than public outdoor recreation uses. The Secretary shall approve such conversion only if he finds it to be in accord with the then existing comprehensive statewide outdoor recreation plan and only upon such conditions as he deems necessary to assure the substation of other recreation properties of at least equal fair market value and of reasonably equivalent usefulness and location."

Section 3. City certifies that it has matching funds from eligible source(s) and can finance 100 percent of the Project, which up to half may be reimbursed.

Section 4. City appoints the City Manager as agent of the Applicant to conduct all negotiations and execute and submit all documents, including, but not limited to, applications, contracts, amendments, payment requests, and compliance with all applicable current state and federal laws which may be necessary for the completion of aforementioned Project.
