3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
4 CITY OF LONG BEACH MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS
5 REGARDING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN PUBLIC
6 IMPROVEMENTS WITH REDEVELOPMENT FUNDS
7 (ADMIRAL KIDD PARK TEEN AND COMMUNITY
8 RECREATION CENTER)

10 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach adopted and
11 approved a certain Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan") for the North Long
12 Beach Redevelopment Project (the "Project"); and

13 WHEREAS, in furtherance of the Project and the immediate
14 neighborhood in which the Project is located, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of
15 Long Beach, California (the "Agency"), has recognized the need for certain public
16 improvements, which improvements will be located within the boundaries of the Project,
17 and proposes to use redevelopment funds to finance the improvements; and

18 WHEREAS, Section 33445 of the California Community Redevelopment
19 Law (Health and Safety Code Section 33000 et seq.) requires the Agency to make
20 certain findings prior to the acquisition of land and construction of public improvements
21 or facilities thereon; and

22 WHEREAS, Section 33678 of the Community Redevelopment Law
23 provides that under certain conditions tax increment funds shall not be subject to the
24 appropriations limitation of Article XIII B of the California Constitution;

25 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves
26 as follows:

27 Section 1. The City Council determines that the construction of public
28 improvements, more particularly described in Exhibit "A", are of benefit to the Project

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1 and the immediate neighborhood in which the Project is located. This finding is
2 supported by the following facts:

3 Development of the Admiral Kidd Park Teen and Community
4 Recreation Center (Center) will enable the removal of blight. In particular,
5 the Center will replace a tiny, crumbling recreation center, with boarded
6 windows, presently in the park. Residents of the surrounding densely
7 populated neighborhoods are currently underserved in terms of open
8 space and recreational opportunities. The new Center will provide a
9 facility for positive after school activities for high school students and will
10 also enable the expansion of park programming for the entire Westside
11 community. Such community activity will provide additional "eyes"
12 surrounding the Cabrillo High School campus while also helping to create
13 a more positive and nurturing environment.

15 Sec. 2. The City Council determines that no other reasonable
16 means of financing the above-described improvements are available to the community.
17 This finding is supported by the following facts:

18 Before the passage of Proposition 13, most of the City's general
19 operating and capital improvements were funded through property taxes.
20 However, the initiative placed severe constraints on the City's ability to
21 use property tax revenues to offset increases in operating and capital
22 costs. It has also been difficult for the City, by itself, to provide sufficient
23 funds to support the construction of major public improvements. In fiscal
24 year 2005-2006, the limited resources of the City's General Fund are
25 committed to previously incurred obligations and planned projects.

26 Sec. 3. The City Council further determines that the payment of
27 funds for the construction of the public improvements will assist in the elimination of one
28 or more blighting conditions within the Project, and is consistent with the

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implementation plan adopted pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 33490.


Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
