#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Receive the supporting documentation into the record, conclude the public hearing and adopt the Resolution amending the Master Fee and Charges Schedule by updating Strong Motion Instrumentation and Seismic Hazard Mapping Fees. (Citywide)

#### DISCUSSION

As required by California Public Resources Code Section 2705, the City of Long Beach collects a Strong Motion and Seismic Hazard Mapping fee. The fee is collected from applicants during building permit issuance. The amount collected is based on the type and value of construction at rates established by State law. Ninety-five percent of the collected fee amount is remitted to the California State Department of Conservation (State Department) on a quarterly basis. The City is allowed to retain the remaining five percent to cover associated administrative costs.

The State Department recently notified cities and counties of approved legislation, SB 861, which increased this fee effective July 1, 2014. The table below provides a description of the fee change.

Building Type	Current Fee	New Fee
1-3 Story Residential Buildings	\$0.10 per \$1,000 Building Valuation or fraction thereof with a minimum of \$0.50	\$0.13 per \$1,000 Building Valuation or fraction thereof with a minimum of \$0.50
Commercial and Over 3- Story Residential Buildings	\$0.21 per \$1,000 Building Valuation or fraction thereof with a minimum of \$0.50	\$0.28 per \$1,000 Building Valuation or fraction thereof with a minimum of \$0.50

#### TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

SB 861 increased the fee effective July 1, 2014. Because the fee is determined by approved State legislation that is already in effect, the fee change for Strong Motion and Seismic Hazard Mapping is being requested as a stand-alone fee change to the Master Fee and Charges Schedule on August 12, 2014 and will, therefore, not be included as a change when the FY 15 proposed fee changes are presented for City Council consideration as part of the FY 15 Budget adoption process.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The City will continue to remit 95 percent of the fee revenue to the State as required. The remaining five percent currently results in approximately \$2,500 in annual revenue for the City. The fee increase should result in approximately \$750 of additional revenue in the Development Services Fund (EF 337) in the Department of Development Services (DV). There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.

Approve recommendation.

#### RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE MASTER FEE AND CHARGES SCHEDULE FOR INCREASING THE STRONG-MOTION INSTRUMENTATION AND SEISMIC HAZARD MAPPING FEES PURSUANT TO SENATE BILL 861

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach ("City") is required, pursuant to California Public Resources Code Section 2705, to collect a Strong-Motion Instrumentation and Seismic Hazard Mapping Fee; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 861 increased that fee effective July 1, 2014; and WHEREAS, the City Council, at a duly noticed public hearing, took public testimony and input regarding certain proposed new service fees and charges; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Government Code Section 66016, at least fourteen (14) days prior to the public hearing at which this Resolution is adopted, notice of the time and place of the hearing was mailed to eligible interested parties who filed written requests with the City for mailed notice of meetings regarding new fees or service charges; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Government Code 66016, data regarding the estimated cost of the services and the revenue sources anticipated to provide the services was available for public review and comment for ten (10) days prior to the public hearing at which this Resolution was adopted; and

WHEREAS, publication of the notice of public hearing was given in accordance with the provisions of Government Code Section 6062a, ten (10) days in advance of the public hearing at which the adoption of this Resolution was considered;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby

resolves as follows:

The facts set forth in the Recitals of this Resolution are true Section 1. and correct and are hereby incorporated by reference herein as though set forth in full.

Section 2. The City Council hereby approves publication of the Amended Strong-Motion Instrumentation and Seismic Hazard Mapping Fee, as said fees are set forth in Exhibits "A" which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, increasing the Strong-Motion Instrumentation and Seismic Hazard Mapping Fee collected from applicants during building permit issuance based on the type and value of construction at a rate established by state law.

Said revised Master Fee and Charges Schedule is hereby Section 3. directed to be made available to the public for its use for informational purposes, and is not intended as a re-adoption, modification, or amendment of any existing fee or charge previously established by resolution, or any previously adopted fee resolution that is not in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution.

Section 4. Adoption of the new fee set forth and described in this Resolution, and in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, is intended to be remitted to the State and to recover costs necessary to provide the services within the City for which the fees are charged. In adopting the new fee set forth in this Resolution, the City Council of the City of Long Beach is exercising its powers under Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution.

All requirements of California Government Code Sections Section 5. 66000, et seq., are hereby found to have been satisfied.

Section 6. The fees and charges set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, are required to be collected by the City in accordance with California Public Resources Code Section 2705 as amended by Senate Bill 861.

Section 7. The fee and charge adopted and all portions of this Resolution are severable. Should the fee and charge or any portion of this Resolution be adjudged to be invalid and unenforceable by a body of competent jurisdiction, then the remaining

fees and/or Resolution portions shall be, and continue to be, in full force and effect, except as to those fees and/or Resolution portions that have been adjudged invalid. The City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby declares that it would have adopted each of the fees or charges and this Resolution and each section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase and other portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more of the service fees, charges or sections, subsections, clauses, sentences, phrases or other portions of this Resolution may be held invalid or unconstitutional.

All provisions of prior City Council ordinances and resolutions Section 8. establishing the Strong-Motion Instrumentation and Seismic Hazard Mapping Fee are hereby rescinded and repealed in part or in whole to the extent of any conflict between said ordinances and resolutions and the provisions established by this Resolution.

Section 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
