











Q9 Which would you rather see more of in your neighborhood? - Choose A or B.



Q10 Which would you rather see more of in your neighborhood? - Choose A or B.











Q15 Which would you rather see more of in your neighborhood? - Choose A or B.



Q16 Which would you rather see more of in your neighborhood? - Choose A or B.




