Dear Mayor, Council Member Suja Lowenthal, and City Council Members,

My name is Eric Gray and I live at 133 Promenade Walk in the 2nd district. Because I cannot attend Tuesday December 10th council meeting due to a family trip out of state, I am writing this letter instead to offer my full support of BO-Beau's request to obtain not only an **entertainment permit** for the inside of their new establishment, but their request for **limited rooftop entertainment** as well.

Despite the current Entertainment Ordinance, I believe this can be done.

To give you some background, I've had the chance to meet with the Cohn Restaurant Group who own BO-Beau numerous times and I've also gotten to tour their facility with a number of neighbors over the past few months. Cohn Restaurant Group has shown us what measures they have taken to mitigate sound transference between our shared alley which include, adding a significant sound barrier to the back of their rooftop deck towards our building 133 Promenade. The previous owners had no sound barrier. Cohn Restaurant Group has also shown us their plan to face speakers towards Pine Avenue so that 133 Promenade does not bear the brunt of loud music. They have been completely cooperative with us and are willing to do sound checks.

Here is what Cohn Restaurant Group also has and is offering the City of Long Beach:

- 1. They've invested over 4 million dollars onto Pine Avenue.
- 2. They are one of the major pioneers of San Diego's Gaslamp Quarters and have interest in opening additional restaurants after BO-Beau is established.
- 3. They operate over 17 restaurants and a number of these restaurants reside in urban communities such as Pine and the Promenade.
- 4. In their request for an entertainment permit, they've agreed not to use promoters, not to charge admission, and not to have dancing.
- Instead, they are requesting limited rooftop entertainment which includes amplified music, a three person band at maximum, DJs, and karaoke with the ability to turn up or down the sound.

Let's be very clear, Cohn Restaurant Group is the exact type of tenant we want to invest in Downtown Long Beach. Here is a link to their website as well, http://www.cohnrestaurants.com/

Now, I fully understand this is a particular issue and can see the arguments on both sides. On one hand, you have a restaurant that has invested millions of dollars into Downtown Long Beach and have reached out to community members such as myself wanting to work with us. On the other side you have residents that are supportive of downtown businesses succeeding however, they do not want to bear the brunt of extreme loud music from businesses like we have had to in the past with Smooth's Sports Grille and Club Cohiba.

I feel that BO-Beau is being punished for the mistakes of previous business owners that did not take true steps to mitigate noise issues as BO-Beau is doing.
