## **Landmark Designation**

### **Application Timeline:**

#### 1500 East 1st Street

- July 2018 Application submitted.
- December 10, 2018 Cultural Heritage Commission (CHC) held a hearing and recommended that City Council approve the landmark designation.

#### 3200 East 1st Street, 5281 East El Roble, and 3735 Pine Avenue

- February 2019 Applications submitted
- July 8, 2019 CHC held a separate hearing for each property and recommended that City Council approve each property for landmark designation.





## **Landmark Designation**

### Long Beach Municipal Code definition:

A cultural resource qualifies for designation as a Landmark if it retains integrity and manifests one or more of the following criteria:

**Criterion A** - It is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of the City's history; or

**Criterion B** - It is associated with the lives of persons significant in the City's past; or

**Criterion C** - It embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction, or it represents the work of a master, or it possesses high artistic values; or

**Criterion D** - It has yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history.

#### RECOMMENDATION

**Declare** four ordinances amending the Long Beach Municipal Code (LBMC) by adding Section 16.52.2310, 16.52.2320, 16.52.2330, 16.52.2340 relating to the designation of 4 properties located at 1500 East 1st Street, 3200 East 1st Street, 5281 East El Roble Street, and 3735 Pine Avenue, as a Historical Landmark properties, read the first time and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading; and

**Adopt** four resolutions establishing landmark designation for the 4 properties.
