 To serve as the framework for the allocation of scarce housing resources in the City.

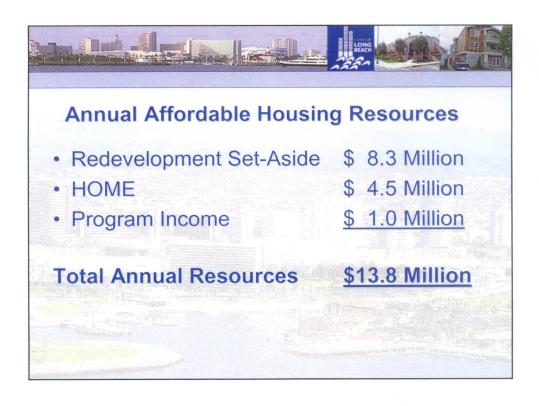
Goals:

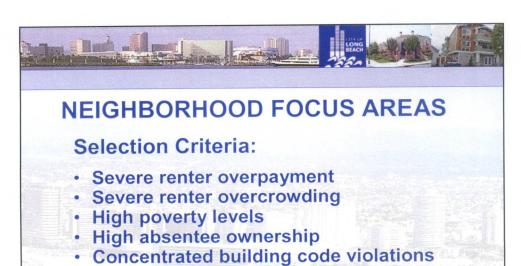

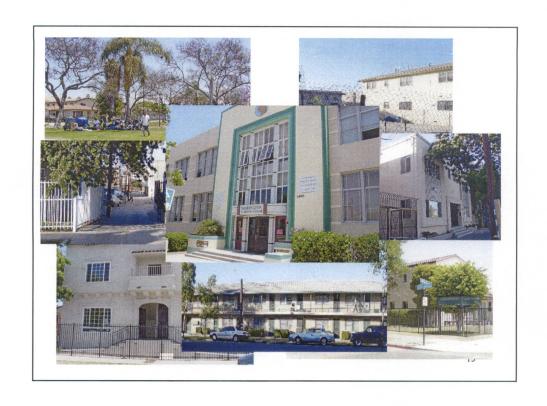
