DISCUSSION

Section 18.17.110 of the Long Beach Municipal Code (Code) permits applicants normally subject to a transportation improvement fee to apply for a credit not to exceed 100 percent of the amount due if the applicant provides specified improvements contained within the transportation improvement plan. The CSULB Foundation has submitted an application requesting a credit of \$190,028.28 in partial consideration of the \$332,869.47 spent by the CSULB Foundation in widening Pacific Coast Highway from Cota Avenue to 19th Street in preparation for the construction of the CSULB Foundation Technology Park.

Presently, the CSULB Foundation Technology Park has five buildings under construction totaling 172,748 square feet. The transportation improvement fee for the initial five buildings totals \$190,028.28. The fully built development plan includes seven additional buildings totaling 208,948 square feet, which are yet to be built. Upon completion, the transportation improvement fee for the seven additional buildings will be \$229,842.80, for a grand total of \$419,871.08. At the appropriate time, the CSULB Foundation plans to apply for an additional credit in transportation fees for the balance of the amount spent for the improvements, plus eligible landscape improvement costs which have not yet been determined or incurred.

Pursuant to the Code, the Director of Public Works has reviewed the application and determined that the construction is a transportation improvement listed in the transportation improvement plan within the Traffic Mitigation Program (TMP) and is consistent with project priorities and timing. In addition, the Director of Public Works has reviewed and found reasonable the documentation submitted in support of the value of the improvements.

The Code requires that after review by the Director of Public Works, the Director shall forward his report, incorporated above, the credit application and supporting documentary evidence (see Attachment) to the City Council for a determination of transportation fee credit.

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If the City Council determines that a transportation improvement fee credit is due, said decision shall be confirmed by ordinance and shall be incorporated in a contract between the applicant and the City.

This item was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Lisa Malmsten on January 15, 2003 and Budget Bureau Manager Mike Killebrew on January 9, 2003.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action on this item is requested on January 28, 2003, in order to facilitate the completion of this project.

FISCAL IMPACT

The CSULB Foundation owes, at this time, a total of \$190,028.28 in transportation improvement fees, based on 172,748 total square footage of five buildings being constructed. A credit of \$190,028.28 will offset the payment of fees by the developer, in partial consideration of \$332,869.47 in transportation improvements constructed by the CSULB Foundation on Pacific Coast Highway from Cota Avenue to 19th Street.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL:

- 1. Find that a transportation improvement fee credit in the amount of \$190,028.28 is due to the California State University Long Beach Foundation in accordance with Section 18.17.110 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- 2. Request the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance confirming the transportation improvement fee credit.
- 3. Authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with the CSULB Foundation granting a transportation improvement fee credit in the amount of \$190,028.28 in consideration of transportation improvements constructed on Pacific Coast Highway from Cota Avenue to 19th Street.
