Subject: Declare August 26, 2019-August 20, 2020 The Long Beach Suffrage Centennial

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive and file a presentation from **The Centennial Circle of Women** on the 2020 Women's Vote Centennial Initiative commemorating the Suffrage Centennial. Direct the City Manager to create a fund that would support 100 events citywide to increase civic engagement and to raise awareness about the history of Women's Right to Vote.

DISCUSSION

The year 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment, guaranteeing and protecting women's constitutional right to vote. This historic centennial offers an unparalleled opportunity to commemorate a milestone of democracy and to explore its relevance to the issues of equal rights today. The Women's Vote Centennial Initiative is a national effort to bring celebration and reflection to the 72 years it took to achieve the constitutional right to vote.

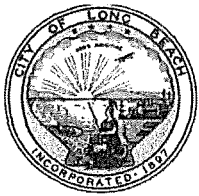
Locally on January 14, 2019, Long Beach women convened a working committee; **The Centennial Circle of Women** to educate, celebrate, facilitate conversation and voter education around women's roles in American Democracy through events such as musicals, movie showings, panels, tea parties.

Women now represent more than 50% of the Long Beach population and continue to contribute to the diversity and fabric of our community. This is an opportunity to engage arts and cultural organizations to use the 2020 Women's Vote Centennial for creative program planning. It also allows to increase voter participation as voters re-connect with the fervent efforts of many past leaders. In creating this opportunity for voters of the future, it creates an appreciation of their right to vote.

Many states and cities across the nation have allocated funding for the purpose of recognizing, educating, and celebrating this monumental time period with their local communities. The state of New York contributed by creating a centennial funding appropriation of \$500,000 to help promote, celebrate and advertise. This, among other states such as Washington, Utah and Kentucky have done similar contributions. Other local efforts in Southern California are also in motion such as the County of Los Angeles Women and Girls Initiative who are in the process of creating a fund of \$50,000 for these efforts. Long Beach, representing the second largest city in Los Angeles County would have the opportunity to partner with the County to hosting our own events.

FISCAL IMPACT

It is anticipated this request will have expenses for movie/film showings, panels, luncheons and other hosted events.

RE: 2020 Centennial of the 19th Amendment

Honorable Mayor Garcia, Members of Long Beach City Council, and City Manager Pat West:

August 26, 2020 will be the Centennial of the 19th Amendment, establishing the vote for women. Across the country, in all 50 states, in hundreds of cities and women's organizations, celebration plans have begun. From statues of women in Central Park to a float in the Pasadena Rose Parade, ideas large and small are under way. Lesson plans, library exhibits, award ceremonies, public art, plays, films; there is no limit to what women are cooking up.

The City of Long Beach holds a special place in the buildup to women's suffrage; as reported in the Oakland Tribune, May 17, 1911:

The Tenth Annual Federation of Women's Clubs was held at the Long Beach Ebell Clubhouse. Three hundred delegates, representing 22,000 members, met to discuss the State Amendment granting women the vote. The Suffrage Resolution brought to the floor: "Be it resolved that the California Federation of Women's Clubs endorses the principle of equal suffrage." It was passed along with an appropriation of \$10,000 for the entertainment at the next biennial convention of the national federation.

On January 14, 2019, Long Beach women convened a working committee; **The Centennial Circle of Women**. On February 5, the Circle asked for the endorsement of the Human Relations Commission. In turn, the Commission's approval included this invitation to the City of Long Beach and the Nine Districts to sign on with the Long Beach Centennial Suffrage City-Wide Celebration.

Commencing publicly on August 26, 2019 and concluding on the 100th Anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment, August 26, 2020, we are here to enlist your vote to spreading this City-wide and commit funding from your individual Council Districts as well as the City of Long Beach, in general.

Committees include; art, history, communications, education and events.

Plans: samples: Website, Concerts, Panels, Street Banners, Booklists, Library readings, Photo exhibits, Public art, Gallery shows, Women's awards, a Walking tour of Long Beach's suffrage sites, Women's film festival and Gala closing.

We invite you to adopt **The Long Beach Suffrage Centennial:**

MISSION – to educate, inspire and spotlight the 100th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment City-wide.

VISION – Throughout the Suffrage Centennial Celebration, and long after, it is our vision that Long Beach residents will come to know their vote is precious. While researching, sharing, educating and having fun, women and girls, will discover how the vote was earned, sustained, withheld, eschewed, denied and practiced. Using the many assets and talents of Long Beach, the 19th Amendment enfranchising women, will be documented, honored and memorialized in our diverse and dynamic city. In addition, the LB Suffrage Centennial will be joining with 50 states, hundreds of cities, and the national party for the 100th Birthday of the 19th Amendment.

ACTIONS

Declare August 26, 2019 – August 26, 2020 as **The Long Beach Suffrage Centennial** and commit funds by Council District and Citywide.
