8 WHEREAS, Section 8.56.100 of the Long Beach Municipal Code provides
9 that processing fees for weed removal shall be established by resolution of the Long
10 Beach City Council;

11 WHEREAS, on November 20, 1984, the City Council of the City of Long
12 Beach adopted Resolution No. C-23855 establishing processing fees for weed removal;

13 WHEREAS, it is necessary to maintain fees at a level sufficient to recover
14 the City's cost of processing various administrative activities related to weed removal;

15 WHEREAS, the fees set forth in this resolution have not been revised
16 since November 20, 1984;

17 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves
18 as follows:

19 Section 1. The processing fees for weed removal are hereby fixed and
20 established as follows:

21 PROCESSING FEES FOR WEED REMOVAL

1 Sec. 2. Resolution No. C-23855 is hereby rescinded.

2 Sec. 3. The purpose of the fees herein imposed is to recover for the City
3 its costs of administering and providing the service for which the fee is levied. Such fee
4 or fees do not exceed the reasonable cost of providing services necessary to the
5 activity for which the fee is charged and is not levied for unrelated revenue purposes.

6 Sec. 4. Constitutionality, Severability. If any section, subsection,
7 sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or
8 unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision
9 shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Resolution. The City Council
10 hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and each section, sub-
11 section, sentence, clause and phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or
12 more of the sections, sub-sections, sentences, clauses or phrases hereof be declared
13 invalid or unconstitutional. Additionally, the determination of an unconstitutional or
14 invalid section, subsection, clause or phrase shall have the effect of reviving the prior
15 section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase as previously set forth in Resolution
16 No. C-23855, if by doing so the defect can be cured, as though it had never been
17 amended by this Resolution.

18 Sec. 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by
19 the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify to the vote adopting this resolution.

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
