






Tunua Thrash-Ntuk




MISSION

SMALL BUSINESS SUPPORT

- Business Navigators help direct more than \$500K in resources and provides ongoing support to more than 150 Long Beach small businesses in North and West Long Beach
- North Long Beach Independent Restaurant Owners
 Association established this business group that meets
 monthly to share resources, make connections and support
 one another
- Other Kiva Loans, CEO Small Business Forum, GO Digital! collaborative, etc...





FINANCIAL LITERACY PROGRAMS

- Workshops on topics such as Credit Building, Financial Freedom and Firsttime Home buyer courses
- Partnered with F&M Bank to provide training and access to local banking institutions
- Classes provided in English and Spanish
- Provided \$500 stipends to residents to help establish savings or repair credit





VACCINE / COVID EDUCATION

Many of the underserved communities in Long Beach continue to lag behind in vaccination rates. VA-58 has contracted LBCEI to continue providing information and vaccine education and promotion to resident in Long Beach.





Black Wealth Initiative

- Home Buyer Education Course held the first of 5 HUD certified Home Buyer Education Courses last weekend. More than 25 local residents completed 8-hour training and received certification on their way to first time home ownership
- Local Nonprofit Partners
 contracted with 4 local nonprofits that focus on serving the black communities in Long Beach
- Workforce Connections meeting with local anchor hiring institutions to help create pathways to good, sustainable jobs











LONG BEACH FOOD SUPPORT NETWORK

- Led a collaboration of more than 25 local nonprofits and community organizations that provide free food to the community
- Secured more than 600,000 lbs. of fresh produce and food boxes last year that served more than 4,500 households a month
- The Network provided free food to more than 25,000 people - over 5% of LB population
- Directed more than \$100K in resources to Food Partners serving underserved families and residents

Julie joined the team at the beginning of the pandemic and brought her more than 30 years of experience serving those in need to the food security crisis brought on by COVID-19.

Her passion, commitment and tireless energy helped build a coalition of more than 25 local nonprofits and community organizations that together provided more than 1 Million pounds of food to over 4,500 households a month.
