RESOLUTION NO. RES-21-0096

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF THE RIGHT OF THE SECURITY OFFICERS AT COMMONSPIRIT/DIGNITY HEALTH TO A FREE AND FAIR ELECTION AND REPRESENTATION BY THE SERVICE EMPLOYEES INTERNATIONAL UNION – UNITED HEALTHCARE WORKERS WEST

WHEREAS, CommonSpirit/Dignity Health Security Officers are the frontline proctors of the patients and workers at the CommonSpirit/ Dignity Health care facilities;

WHEREAS, these security officers have reported that they have been most vulnerable during the pandemic due to their high risk of Covid-19 exposure, their lack of readily available personal protective equipment (PPE), inadequate employee staffing levels, and insufficient safety protocols;

WHEREAS, numerous Security Officers employed by CommonSpirit/Dignity Health have reportedly contracted COVID-19, and have, in turn, reportedly infected their family members due to the reasons previously mentioned;

WHEREAS, many Security Officers employed by CommonSpirit/Dignity
Health have come forward to voice their desire to have greater power over their safety
concerns, wages, benefits and terms and conditions of employment;

WHEREAS, these Security Officers believe that a fair and free election to vote for union representation by the Service Employees International Union (SEIU-UHW) will be the pathway to having stronger protections against COVID-19, safer employee staffing levels, sufficient personal protective equipment (PPE), rigorous safety protocols, affordable healthcare coverage, wages that reward experience and seniority, and more respectful and equitable treatment throughout their CommonSpirit/Dignity Health

workplace;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. That the City Council wholly supports the right of the Security Officers at CommonSpirit/Dignity Health to form their union in SEIU-UHW and calls upon CommonSpirit/Dignity Health management to respect the will of these Security Officers by recognizing them as members of the SEIU-UHW; or at the very least, allow these Security Officers to hold a free and fair election so they can vote to form their union for the purpose of obtaining adequate representation.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
