RESOLUTION NO. RES-23-0003 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH THE LONG BEACH PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION COMPANY, WITHOUT ADVERTISING FOR BIDS, FOR THE BELMONT SHORE EMPLOYEE BUS PASS PROGRAM, IN AN ANNUAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$270,000, FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR WITH THE OPTION TO RENEW FOR TWO ADDITIONAL ONE-YEAR PERIODS

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works ("PW") is responsible for the safe and efficient movement of people and goods by using a multi-modal transportation network and through transportation planning; and

WHEREAS, the Belmont Shore Employee Bus Pass Program ("Program") was established in 2012 by the Belmont Shore Business Association ("BSBA") and the Belmont Shore Parking and Business Improvement Area Advisory Commission ("Commission") as an option to mitigate resident and patron parking challenges; and

WHEREAS, a contract was awarded on August 8, 2017 to the Long Beach
Public Transportation Company ("LBT") to provide employees of Belmont Shore
businesses unlimited rides on all LBT bus routes seven days per week at no cost; and

WHEREAS, due to the Program's success, the City Council approved
multiple extension, and funding was provided by both parking meter revenues overseen by
the Commission and Proposition A funds; and

WHEREAS, the contract was set to expire on August 31, 2020; however, prior to the expiration date, the Commission voted unanimously to suspend the Program on February 20, 2020; and

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WHEREAS, PW seeks to continue Program services based on community
 feedback received from residents and Belmont Shore businesses; and
 WHEREAS, the Commission voted unanimously on June 16, 2022 to
 reinstate the Program; and

5 WHEREAS, LBT is the established public transportation company for Long
6 Beach and the only company who currently provides existing bus services to City residents
7 through the Belmont Shore Business Improvement District area; and

8 WHEREAS, as a result, no useful purpose would be served by advertising
9 for bids and to do so would constitute an idle and useless act and unnecessary expenditure
10 of public funds;

11 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as12 follows:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract
with the Long Beach Public Transportation Company, without advertising for bids, for the
reinstallation of the Belmont Shore Employee Bus Pass Program, in an annual amount not
to exceed Two Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$270,000), for a period of one (1) year,
with the option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year periods, at the discretion of the
City Manager.

19Section 2.This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption20by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
