RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to execute a contract with Envision Solar International, Inc., of San Diego, CA, for the purchase of two solar-powered electric vehicle charging stations, under the same terms and conditions afforded the State of California, in an amount not to exceed \$152,055, inclusive of taxes and fees. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

City Council approval is requested to enter into a contract with Envision Solar International, for the purchase of two electric vehicle Autonomous Renewable Chargers for use by various departments in the City that have electric or hybrid electric vehicles and for emergency charging in the event of a power outage.

The purchase of the two portable solar-powered charging stations will be the start of the infrastructure needed to support expansion of the City's use of electric vehicles. Each charging station is capable of charging three electric vehicles simultaneously while permanent infrastructure is being implemented.

City Charter Section 1802 provides an alternative procurement method by permitting the City to purchase or otherwise obtain services, supplies, materials, equipment, and labor with other governmental agencies by purchasing under their contracts on a voluntary and selective basis when authorized by a Resolution of the City Council.

The Fleet Services Bureau and Purchasing Division of the Financial Management Department investigated procurement options, and the State of California's agreement with Envision Solar International, Inc., of San Diego, CA (not a SBE, DBE, MBE, WBE, or Local), was determined to provide the best discounted price while allowing for timely acquisition and delivery. All State of California contracts are competitively bid and offer the best available pricing.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Monica J. Kilaita on March 21, 2018 and by Interim Budget Bureau Manager Grace Yoon on March 30, 2018.

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SUSTAINABILITY

These charging stations comply with all State of California regulations and local district air quality regulations.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on April 17, 2018, to ensure a new contract is in place expeditiously.

FISCAL IMPACT

The cost of this contract will not exceed \$152,055, and is budgeted in the Fleet Services Fund (IS 386) in the Financial Management Department (FM). Electric vehicle charging stations are eligible for AB 2766 funding. AB 2766 funding is budgeted in the Transportation Fund (SR 182) in the Financial Management Department (FM). There are no annual operating costs for electricity delivered by these units. Maintenance costs for the stations will be budgeted in the Fleet Services Fund (IS 386), paid for by funds collected through regular monthly billing charges to electric vehicle users through the Fleet Services MOU. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.

SUGGESTED ACTION:

Approve recommendation.

5 MANAGER TO PURCHASE TWO SOLAR-POWERED
6 ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS THROUGH
7 THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
8 AND ENVISION SOLAR INTERNATIONAL, INC.

10 WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Long Beach (the "City"), Section
11 1802, permits the City to purchase services, supplies, materials, equipment and labor
12 with other government agencies by purchasing under their contracts on a voluntary and
13 selective basis when authorized by resolution; and

14 WHEREAS, the City desires to purchase Two Solar-Powered Electric
15 Vehicle Charging Stations ("Charging Stations"); and

16 WHEREAS, the STATE OF CALIFORNIA has a contact with ENVISION
17 SOLAR INTERNATIONAL, INC., for the purchase of these Charging Stations, Contract
18 No. #1-15-61-16 ("State Contract"); and

19 WHEREAS, the City's participation in the State Contract will facilitate
20 acquisition of these Charging Stations as well as provide considerable cost benefits to
21 the City; and

22 WHEREAS, if the City had to go to formal bid rather than participate in the
23 State Contract considerably more funds would be required;

24 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
25 follows:

26 The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this
27 reference.

28 The City Manager or designee of the City is hereby authorized to enter an

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1 agreement with ENVISION SOLAR INTERNATIONAL, INC. to purchase Charging
2 Stations of substantially the same type and kind purchased by the STATE OF
3 CALIFORNIA pursuant to the State Contract except as modified by mutual agreement of
4 the City and ENVISION SOLAR INTERNATIONAL, INC., and the purchase by the City
5 shall be on the same terms and conditions afforded to the STATE OF CALIFORNIA in an
6 amount not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Two Thousand Fifty Five Dollars (\$152,055)
7 including taxes and fees.

8 This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City
9 Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
