3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
4 CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF STARBUCKS
5 WORKERS' RIGHT TO ORGANIZE.

7 WHEREAS, over the past several years, the Long Beach City Council has
8 endeavored to protect workers' rights and more recently to enable a fair and equitable
9 recovery from COVID-19 for its community, combatting the K-shaped recovery seen
10 across America; and

11 WHEREAS, supporting the right of workers to organize and advocate for
12 better conditions, without fear of unjust reprisal, is a key component of any equitable
13 recovery plan; and

14 WHEREAS, the first Long Beach Starbucks to file to join Starbucks Workers
15 United, the new union representing stores across America, is located in the Second
16 District in the City of Long Beach at Redondo and 7th; and

17 WHEREAS, the election among that location's workers has officially
18 concluded and the employees voted to unionize, becoming one of the first Starbucks
19 stores in Southern California to vote to join a union; and

20 WHEREAS, another Starbucks location in Long Beach, in Belmont Shore,
21 is currently in the process of setting up its union election after filing an initial petition; and

22 WHEREAS, supporting Starbucks workers in their efforts to unionize will
23 empower them to collectively bargain with their multinational employer for better wages,
24 better working conditions, and overall greater dignity in the workplace and a better quality
25 of life; and

26 WHEREAS, workers at Starbucks locations have reported difficulties doing
27 their jobs due to COVID-19, supply shortages, constant movement of team members
28 between stores, customers not following COVID-19 precautions, and other issues; and

1 WHEREAS, early in the pandemic, Starbucks closed some stores, and the
2 pandemic highlighted how hard service industry jobs are and the importance of workers
3 having the ability to advocate for better living standards; and

4 WHEREAS, also early in the pandemic, there was an increased pay rate
5 when Starbucks employees were deemed essential workers, yet after stores started re-
6 opening, the pay rates returned to pre-pandemic levels; and

7 WHEREAS, as we are aware, the pandemic continues to cause difficult
8 working conditions and an elevated risk level; and

9 WHEREAS, Starbucks workers now demand a seat at the table to
10 determine democratically what they want to see in their workplaces with respect to the
11 various risks they face, their working conditions, and compensations they earn; and

12 WHEREAS, a union is an important tool by which workers may directly hold
13 their distant corporate leaders accountable for good working conditions and equitable pay
14 and treatment; and

15 WHEREAS, these workers have faced public and corporate reprisals,
16 alleged through numerous complaints issued by the National Labor Relations Board
17 (NLRB), and have faced aggressive anti-worker efforts from their corporate leaders
18 during their attempts to unionize; and

19 WHEREAS, for instance, the NLRB issued a complaint in May 2022,
20 against Starbucks alleging over 200 violations of the National Labor Relations Act
21 claiming that Starbucks interfered with, restrained and/or coerced employees seeking to
22 unionize in various ways; and

23 WHEREAS, this Resolution of strong support by the City Council will signal
24 workers in Long Beach, as well as all of the City's residents and visitors, that their elected
25 leaders and their community stand with the workers and support their efforts to empower
26 themselves through collective action;
