(Standard Agreement)

SCOPE OF WORK

5. Detailed description of work to be performed:

- A. The weapons firing range use shall be limited to CHP personnel assigned to the CHP South Los Angeles Area office. Approximate number of CHP personnel using range: (124).
- B. City agrees that CHP shall have the use of all on-site facilities located on the range for training programs without additional charge.
- C. City and CHP agree the weapons firing range shall be open and usable by members of CHP at such times that are mutually agreeable to both parties. Exclusive use of the facilities by CHP must be coordinated and mutually agreed to by both parties.
- D. The CHP agrees that its members using the weapons firing range facilities under this Agreement shall be governed by the range safety rules established by City.
- E. Brass will be retained by City.
- F. The weapons firing range must be able to accommodate up to eighteen (18) shoots per year. The following information is a sample of need:
 - 1) .40 caliber pistol (loaded with Department-issued ammunition currently 180G).
 - a. Twelve (12) shoots per year, one (1) each month or two (2) every other month.
 - b. Two (2) qualification shoots which must be performed at the following distances:
2 yards, 4 yards, 7 yards, 10 yards, 15 yards, and 25 yards.
 - c. Ten (10) practice shoots, of which two (2) night shoots are recommended.
 - d. Use for make-up shoots at times mutually agreeable to both parties.
 - 2) Tactical rifle (.223 caliber).
 - a. Four (4) shoots per year (quarterly).
 - b. One (1) night shoot is required.
 - c. Maximum distance of 50 yards.
 - 3) Shotgun (00 buckshot).
 - a. Eight (8) shoots per year (two (2) quarterly).
 - b. Two (2) night shoots required.
 - c. Distance 15 yards maximum.
- G. Inspection and test firing of weapons:
 - 1) All weapons are to be test fired after each required inspection by the Area Weapons Range Officer.
 - 2) Use of facility to test fire weapons will be coordinated between the Area Weapons Range Officer and the City.

EXHIBIT B
(Standard Agreement)

BUDGET DETAIL AND PAYMENT PROVISIONS

1. Invoicing and Payment

- A. For services satisfactorily rendered, and upon receipt and approval of the invoices, the state agrees to compensate the City for actual expenditures incurred in accordance with the rates specified herein, which is attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement.
- B. Invoices shall include the Agreement Number and shall be submitted in duplicate not more frequently than monthly in arrears to:

2. Budget Contingency Clause

- A. It is mutually agreed that if the Budget Act of the current year and/or any subsequent years covered under this Agreement does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this Agreement shall be of no further force and effect. In this event, the state shall have no liability to pay any funds whatsoever to City or to furnish any other considerations under this Agreement and City shall not be obligated to perform any provisions of this Agreement.
- B. If funding for any fiscal year is reduced or deleted by the Budget Act for purposes of this program, the state shall have the option to either cancel this Agreement with no liability occurring to the state, or offer an agreement amendment to City to reflect the reduced amount.

3. Prompt Payment Clause

Payment will be made in accordance with, and within the time specified in, Government Code Chapter 4.5, commencing with Section 927.

4. Rate Schedule

The CHP agrees to pay City Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) per day, for use of the weapons range facility for the South Los Angeles Area office.

EXHIBIT D
(Standard Agreement)

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. CHP reserves the right to cancel this Agreement with thirty (30) days prior written notice to the City.
- ~~2. City reserves the right to cancel this Agreement with thirty (30) days prior written notice to CHP.~~
3. This Agreement may be amended in writing with mutual consent of the parties hereto.
4. CHP employees and officers are not employees of the City of Long Beach, and therefore are not entitled to any of the benefits afforded to the City of Long Beach employees.
5. City represents that there are no existing environmental actions or concerns known to exist as to the property to be used for the purpose of this Agreement, and that City is currently in compliance with all appropriate federal and state environmental obligations including, but not limited to lead mitigation. City agrees that compliance with these obligations is the sole responsibility of the City.
6. The parties hereto agree to indemnify, defend and save harmless the other party, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by the other party in the performance of this Agreement.
