## **INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS**

#### 1. PREPARATION OF BID:

The preparation of the Bid, including visits to the Site prior to submittal of the Bid, shall be at the expense of Bidder. All prices and notations must be typewritten or written in Ink. Any markings in pencil shall not form part of the Bid and shall be disregarded by the City. Any changes or corrections in the Bid must be initiated in ink by the person signing the Bid. Bidder shall state brand name or make of each Item bid. If not bidding on Item as described, the manufacturer's name and catalog number of the substitute must be given. Bidder shall also attach specifications and furnish other data to establish the suitability of the substitute. Bidder shall quote separately on each item. Bidder shall quote his lowest price and best delivery date as no changes are permitted after the bid opening. Cash discounts offered for payment within fourteen (14) days or less will not be considered when evaluating bids. No telephonic, telegraphic or fax Bids are acceptable.

# NOTE: ALL PAGES OF THE INVITATION TO BID MUST BE RETURNED.

#### 2. EXAMINATION OF BID:

Bidder is responsible for examining the Invitation to Bid and submitting its Bid complete and in conformance with these instructions.

#### 3. CONDITIONS OF WORK:

Bidder shall carefully examine the Site to become fully informed regarding all existing and expected conditions and matters, which could affect performance, cost or time of the Work.

#### 4. DISCREPANCIES IN BID DOCUMENTS:

If Bidder finds discrepancies in or omissions from the Invitation to Bid, if the intent of the Invitation is not clear, or if provisions of the Specifications restrict Bidder from bidding, he may request In writing that the deficiency(s) be modified. Such request must be received by the City Purchasing Agent at least five (5) working days before bid opening date. Bidders will be notified by Addendum of any approved changes in the Invitation to Bid.

#### 5. ORAL STATEMENTS:

The City of Long Beach shall not be bound by oral statements made by any employee or agent concerning this invitation to Bid. If Bidder requires specific information, Bidder must request it in writing and obtain a reply in writing from the City.

#### 6. BRAND NAMES AND SPECIFICATIONS:

The detailed specifications and/or brand names stated are descriptive only and indicate quality, design and construction of items required. Offers will be considered to supply articles substantially the same as those described herein but with minor variations. Bidders must describe variations in the Bid. Substitute items must be equal in quality, utility and performance. The phrase "or approved equal" throughout the specifications means that the City in its sole and absolute discretion shall make the final determination whether or not the substitute items are equal.

#### 7. AWARD:

Bid shall be subject to acceptance by the City for a period of three (3) months unless a lesser period is prescribed in the quotation by Bidder. The City reserves the right to award all items to one Bidder, or to award separate items or groups of items to various Bidders, or to increase or decrease the quantities of any item. Bidder may submit alternate prices or name a lump sum or discount conditional on two or more items being awarded to him.

The City's purchases of goods and services are based on the City's actual needs and requirements. The City is obligated under this contract/purchase order to purchase and pay for only those goods and services that the City needs and requires, and that the City actually orders and receives. Any dollar amount identified as a "not to exceed:" amount in any City document is not a guaranteed payment amount to any contractor or service provider. Furthermore, the City may determine that its needs and requirements may be met by City labor or by a second contractor or service provider, even after an award is made to one contractor or service provider. An award is not a promise or guarantee of exclusivity.

Bidders are cautioned that comments and statements, whether oral or written, made by City employees regarding the validity of Bids, the waiver of devialions from Specifications, the possibility or probability of an award being made to a particular Bidder, and other similar matters are NOT binding on the City. Bidders should not order materials, obtain financing or take other actions based on such comments and statements. Only authorization of a Contract by the City Council or issuance of a Purchase Order is conclusive and binding on the City with respect to this Bid and its resulting Contract or Purchase Order. However, prior to authorization by the City Council or issuance of the Purchase Order, Bidders may rely on: (1) approval of an "equal" or "substitute" item which will be issued in writing, and (2) written notice of Intent to award by the City Council, which is often issued prior to the authorization by the City Council so that a Bidder can order materials that have a long lead time.

#### 8. PAYMENT:

Payment terms are NET/30 unless Bidder otherwise quotes. All Cash Discounts shall be taken and computed from the date of delivery or completion and acceptance of the material, or from date of receipt of invoice, whichever occurs last. Invoices must be submitted as specified at the time of shipping authorization, Partial payments may be made by the City on delivery & acceptance of goods and on receipt of Contractor's invoice.

In the event the Contract to be awarded hereunder, including specifications and other documents incorporated therein by reference, provides for the withholding of moneys by the City to ensure performance of such Contract, Contractor may deposit with the City, as a substitute for said withheld moneys, securities listed in Section 16430 of the California Government Code or bank or savings and loan certificates of deposit, or both, equivalent to the amount withhold, provided Contractor requests permission to make such substitution and bears all expenses in connection therewith.

#### 9. SAFETY APPROVAL:

Where required by City Regulations, any items delivered must carry Underwriters Laboratories Approval or City of Long Beach City Safety Officer approval. Failure to so comply will be cause to reject Bid. Also, any equipment must conform with the Safety Orders of the California Division of Industrial Safety and OSHA regulations.

## 10. BUSINESS LICENSE:

The Long Beach Municipal Code (LBMC) requires all businesses operating in the City of Long Beach to pay a business license tax. In some cases the City may require a regulatory permit and/or evidence of a State or Federal license. Prior to issuing a business license, certain business types will require the business license application and/or business location to be reviewed by the Development Services, Fire, Health, and/or Police Departments. #### INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

#### 11. PUBLIC WORK AND PREVAILING WAGES:

The Contractor to whom the contract is awarded, along with its subcontractors, shall pay not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem, holiday and overtime wages established by the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) of the State of California for the locality in which the public work is to be performed for each craft, classification or type of worker needed to execute the contract. #### 13. SAMPLES:

Samples of items when requested or required must be furnished to the City free of expense to the City and, if not destroyed by tests, will upon request be returned at Bidder's expense.

#### 14. PRICES:

Prices shall be in accordance with those extended to other governmental agencies. In case of error in extension of prices, unit price will govern. All prices must be firm for the Contract term unless the City specifically provides for adjustment.

Contractor warrants that the goods, machinery, equipment delivered or the work performed hereunder shall conform to the specifications, drawings, samples or other description specified by the City and shall be fit and sufficient for the purpose intended, merchantable, of good material and workmanship, in good working order and free from defect or faulty workmanship for a period of ninety (90) days. - (b) Workers' compensation coverage as required by the Labor Code of the State of California and Employer's liability insurance with minimum limits of One Million Dollars (US \$1,000,000) per accident or occupational illness. #### AWARD

The City prefers to award to a single vendor but reserves the right to award contracts to multiple vendors. The City reserves the right in its sole discretion to award all items to one bidder, or to PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

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award separate items or groups of items to various bidders, or to increase or decrease the quantities of any item. The City reserves the right to reject at any time any or all bids.

Items shall be evaluated upon, but not limited to, specification compliance, availability, pricing and ease of use and warranty considerations.

The City shall purchase lubricating oil and industrial oil from the bidder whose oil product contains the greater percentage of re-refined oil, if the availability, fitness, quality and price of the recycled oil product is otherwise equal to, or better than, virgin oil products.

## RIGHT TO REJECT BID

The City reserves the right, in its discretion, to reject any and all Bids and, to the extent not prohibited by law, to waive any minor irregularity or informality in any Bid that does not affect the validity of the Bid or does not give the bidder a competitive advantage over other bidders.

## **BID PROTEST PROCEDURES**

## Who May Protest

Only a bidder who has actually submitted a bid proposal is eligible to protest a bid. The City will not accept or entertain bid protests from manufacturers, vendors, suppliers, subcontractors or the like. A bidder may not rely on the bid protest submitted by another bidder, but must timely pursue its own protest.

## Time for Protest

A bidder desiring to protest a bid shall file the protest within five (5) business days of the electronic notification of intent to award. The City Purchasing Agent must receive the protest by the close of the business on the fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) business day following posting of notification of intent to award the contract.

#### Form of Protest

The protest must be in writing and signed by the individual who signed the bid or, if the bidder is a corporation, by an officer of the corporation, and addressed to the City Purchasing Agent. Any protest shall be made only by e-mail to the City. A protest must set forth a complete and detailed statement of the grounds for the protest and include all relevant information to support the grounds stated, must refer to the specific portion(s) of the contract documents upon which the protest is based, and shall include a valid e-mail address, street address, and phone number sufficient to ensure the City's response will be received.

Once the protest is received by the City Purchasing Agent, the City will not accept additional information on the protest unless the City itself requests it. In that case, the additional information must be submitted within three (3) business days after the request is made and must be received by the City Purchasing Agent by the close of the business on the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) business day.

The City Purchasing Agent or designee will respond, by e-mail or regular mail to the addresses provided in the protest, with a decision regarding the protest within five (5) business days following receipt of the protest or, if applicable, the receipt of requested additional information.

## **SPECIFICATIONS**

The decision of the City Purchasing Agent shall be final and conclusive.

The procedure and time limits set forth herein are mandatory and are the bidder's sole and exclusive remedy in the event of bid protest. The bidder's failure to comply with these procedures shall constitute a waiver of any right to further pursue a bid protest, including filling a Government Code Claim or initiation of legal proceedings.

## ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FROM FUNDING SOURCE

Any Contract arising from this procurement process may be funded in whole or in part by various granting agencies. Pursuant to said grants, the Awarded Vendor is required to comply with (and to incorporate into its agreements with any sub-vendors) the following provisions in the performance of the Contract, as applicable.

### BID DUE DATE HAS BEEN EXTENED TO MARCH 19, 2021 @ 11:00 AM

1) Question: Is the City asking for firm/fixed pricing for 24 months? The oil manufacturers will only offer firm/fixed pricing for bids and large volume customers for a period of 6 months. Pricing only increases or decreases based on the manufacturer's discretion for changes occurring within the market. If a nation-wide change in price (up or down) is announced by the oil manufacturers, the change would be announced 30 days in advance in writing accompanied by the manufacturer's price letter.

Answer: Price should be set for 12 months and only increase with CPI each year

2) Question: Option years: is the City asking for firm/fixed pricing for each renewal year...with review/negotiations allowed only at time of renewal?

Answer: Yes. If a price increase is requested in cannot exceed the CPI for that time

3) Question: Is the CPI criteria the actual parameter for pricing? If so, I don't see how any bidder would put themselves at such a high risk.

Answer: CPI is only at renewal

4) Question: Will the City consider firm/fixed pricing for 6 months with changes allowed (up/down) based on the manufacturer's discretion...which only moves with the industry market. Price increases will on be allowed at each renewal year

Answer: Prices are to remain firm for 12 months and each renewal may only be increased based on CPI

5) Question: Estimated quantities are for 24 months or 12 months

Answer: Estimated quantities are for 12 months

6) Question: Antifreeze: please kindly provide current product being used (brand, product name, specifications). There are several coolants in the market that could potentially meet all of the vehicle OEMs listed (Honda, GM, Ford, etc.), and there is no "synthetic" antifreeze...only "extended life coolant"...and of course everything in between (conventional/green, dexcool/orange, universal/yellow, etc.). By providing further information, bidders will be able to quote accurately.

Answer: DK600P multipurpose coolant made by World Oil Corp.

7) Question: Price Pages - Pages 23 & 24 vs Line Items on the Planet Bids price sheet): I see some discrepancies with regards to quantities. Example: Line Item 12, 3C = 75,000 gallons...I think this is meant to be 7,500 gallons(?)

Answer: Yes, it should be 7500 gallons

8) Question: Can you please provide specific details for each listing under the category segments (motor oil, hydraulic oil, etc.)? I see some Information has been provided, but it's not enough information for bidders to truly be able to decipher which products the City is asking for. What would be helpful is having the current brand, product name/description, and specifications, and grade of motor oil (e.g. Chevron Supreme motor oil SAE 5w20, GF-5/SN+). Otherwise, you may get bidders providing pricing/products that don't match your requirements

Answer: Chevron 15/40

9) Question: Please clarify bout some of the line items. They seem to be repeats. Example: Line 13 & 14: the specifications are all the same with the exception of the motor oil grades (10w30 vs 15w40). The issue is, there is not one universal product that would meet all of these specifications as some are for "passenger car/light-duty" applications, and others are for "heavy-duty" applications.

Answer: We are looking to see if the market has develop this type of product. If you don't have this as an option to bid, please leave blank or put n/a.

10) Question: I'm also a little confused about the fact that each category (motor oil, hydraulic oil, etc.) has 1 line with one quantity, but is asking for multiple types of oils (conventional, synthetic-blend, and synthetic). Does the City have a preference? Or are you looking for "lowest price?"

Answer: Synthetic is our most used product but, we have some older units we still use conventional.

11) Question: Hydraulic Oils: please provide additional information as there are so many hydraulic oils in the market, and each is made for specific applications. Not so much the conventional, but the full synthetic hydraulic oils. If you have the brand, product name, data sheet and/or applications, this would be very helpful to ensure bidders are quoting accurately.

Answer: The City is currently using Performance 500 REQ HYD AW32.

12) Question: There seem to be repeats (Line 15 & 17, Line 10/10A & Line 11/11A, etc.). The estimated quantities are listed but seem to repeat. (19,600 gallons is shown twice on the price sheet, for example. Does this mean that the City is actually using 2 different products with a total estimated gallons of 39,200 of this product)

Answer: No, 19,600 is the amount, we bid two products in the case we want to switch to the other product in the future.

Answer: Currently using Castrol Duratec ES 15W-40, we require equal or better.

2. Question: Item #8-2C: a full synthetic low ash product is not available in the market, only synthetic blend and conventional. Should bidders submit "N/A" for this item?

Answer: Yes

3. Question: Item #12-3C: per question 7 on the addendum, the answer given was "Yes, it should be 7,500 gallons" but the electronic price sheet is still showing 75,000 gallons. Please kindly update.

Answer: The line item has been corrected to 7,500. Please adjust your bid accordingly.

4. Question: Item #13: please confirm that 26,000 gallons is the correct quantity; this product/amount was not listed in bid document price sheet:

Answer: That is correct, it was on Word PDF, not on excel sheet.

5. Question: Item #14: please confirm that 4,900 gallons is the correct quantity; this product/amount was not listed in bid document price sheet:

Answer: That is correct, it was on Word PDF, not on excel sheet.

6. Question: Item #27-10 & Item #28-10A: specifications are not clear. "MIL-H-5606" is an aviation hydraulic fluid, and "API GL-5" refers to gear oil...but not a specific grade. If this is gear oil, please indicate whether it is 80w90 or 85w140 grade

Answer: This is gear oil, currently using Delo Synthetic 80W-140

7. Question: Item #29-11 & Item #30-11A: specifications are not clear; same issue as above. If this is synthetic gear oil, please indicate whether it is 75w90 or 80w140 grade.

Answer: This is gear oil, currently using Delo Synthetic 80W-140

8. Question: Item #31-12 & Item #32-12A: there is no ATF on the market that will cover all of the specifications listed. There are "multi-vehicle" automatic transmission fluids that cover several specifications, but "Type F" is not covered under them...it is a stand-alone product. Please provide additional information and/or the current <u>product name/description</u> the City is using:

Answer: Chevron Delo Syn ATF HD

9. Question: Item #33-13 & Item #34-13A: same issue as above. Please provide additional information and/or the current <u>product name/description</u> the City is using (to be clear, there are "multi-vehicle" ATFs in the market—conventional & full synthetic—but neither covers the "Type F" specification. In addition, the conventional product & synthetic product do not cover the same specifications. They are completely different products/separate applications)

Answer: Chevron Delo Syn ATF HD

10. Question: Antifreeze/Coolant: the answer to Question 6 in the addendum was "DK600P multipurpose coolant made by World Oil Corp." However, the specifications for this product are different from the others listed for Items #40-44 on the price sheet. Example: Item #44-19 states "Shall be Nitrite free..." which the World Oil Corp. multipurpose coolant covers, but the other coolant descriptions don't mention this. Please clarify if Items #40-44 are the same coolant. If they are different, please provide additional specifications. Items 40-42 are the same coolant and what we are currently using now, they are just in different delivery methods. 43 and 44 are on the excel document but, not the price sheet.

Answer: Item 43 is a recycled antifreeze, we currently don't use this type of product but, want to inquire about price and availability. Based on that info, a decision might be made to utilize some of this product.

Item 44 is inquiring about a universal coolant that is compatible in the engine types and mfgs listed in the description. City of Long Beach is inquiring if this product is available and if so, what would be the price. If no product can be offered to meet these specs, then put no bid or n/a.
