### **RECOMMENDATION**

Planning Commission recommends that City Council approve the proposed street name of Barbara London Drive for an unnamed private street within the airport as shown on the attached sketch.

### REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

- 1. The new street name is consistent with the requirements listed in Chapter 20.36.110 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- 2. The proposed street name is in honor of a WWII aviator who flew with the Women's Airforce Service Pilots and 6<sup>th</sup> Ferrying Group based in Long Beach, CA.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Public Works Department has proposed that an unnamed private street in the airport be named after a WWII female aviator based in Long Beach. The north/south street, which leads to Donald Douglas Drive, is currently referred to as the "loop road." This road is adjacent to parking lots A and B and there are no businesses located on the loop road.

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Barbara London was the first commanding officer of the Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS), later known as Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) and commanding officer of the 6<sup>th</sup> Ferrying Group based in Long Beach, CA during WWII.

Chapter 20.36.110 of the Long Beach Municipal Code regulates street names. Proposed street names shall be substantially different from each other and from existing street names so as not to be confusing in sound or spelling. Each proposed street that is a continuation of any existing street shall be given the same name as such existing street. Street name changes may be initiated by anyone who believes it is necessary by filing the appropriate fee with the Director of Planning and Building. The Director of Planning and Building shall submit the proposed change with the sketch map prepared by engineering to the Planning Commission and the City Council for review. All abutting property owners and residents who will be affected by the proposed change shall be notified by mail of the scheduled public hearing on such a change. After the public hearing, the Planning Commission shall recommend such change to the City Council. After receipt of the Planning Commission recommendation, the council may act to change said street name by resolution and direct the Director of Public Works to change such maps and street signs as are necessary.

## **CURRENT ACTION REQUESTED**

The current action requested is to establish a street name for an unnamed private street within the airport currently know as the loop road, to Barbara London Drive. This change will acknowledge a historically significant aviator.

### **PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE**

A Public Hearing Notice was mailed to the applicant to post on-site and to the representative of the 5th Council District.

### REDEVELOPMENT REVIEW

The site is not located within a Redevelopment Project Area.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

The proposed action has been determined to be categorically exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act and the CEQA Guidelines. A Categorical Exemption (CE 04-238) was issued on October 14, 2004 under a Class 1 exemption (CEQA Guideline Section 15301).

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## IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE PLANNING COMMISSION:

Recommend that City Council approve the proposed name of Barbara London Drive for an unnamed private street within the airport as shown on the attached sketch.

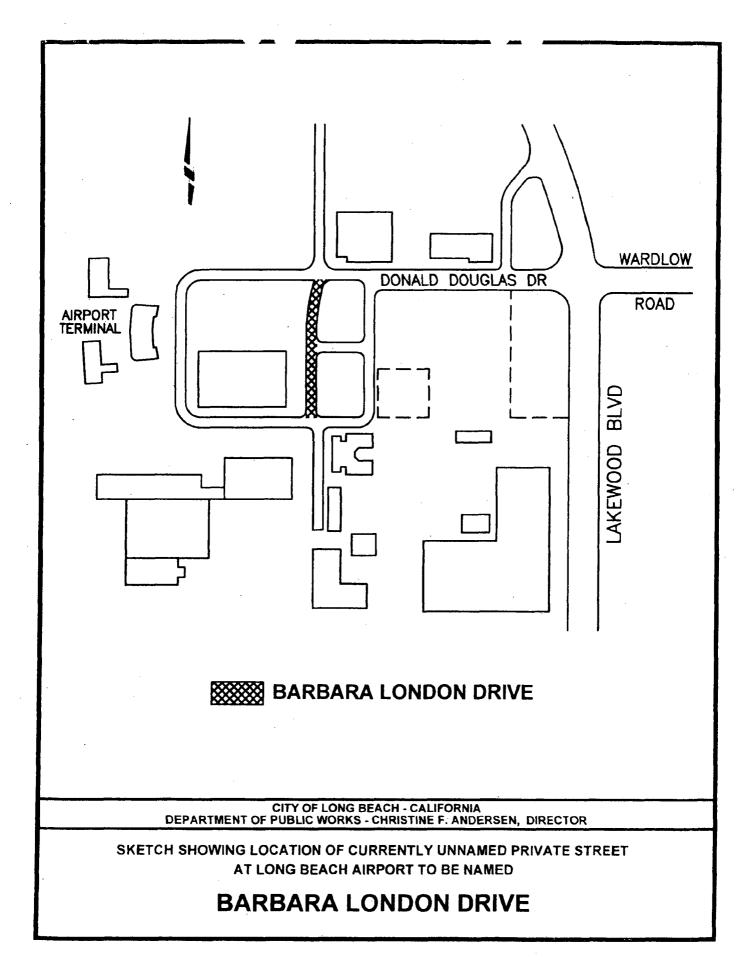

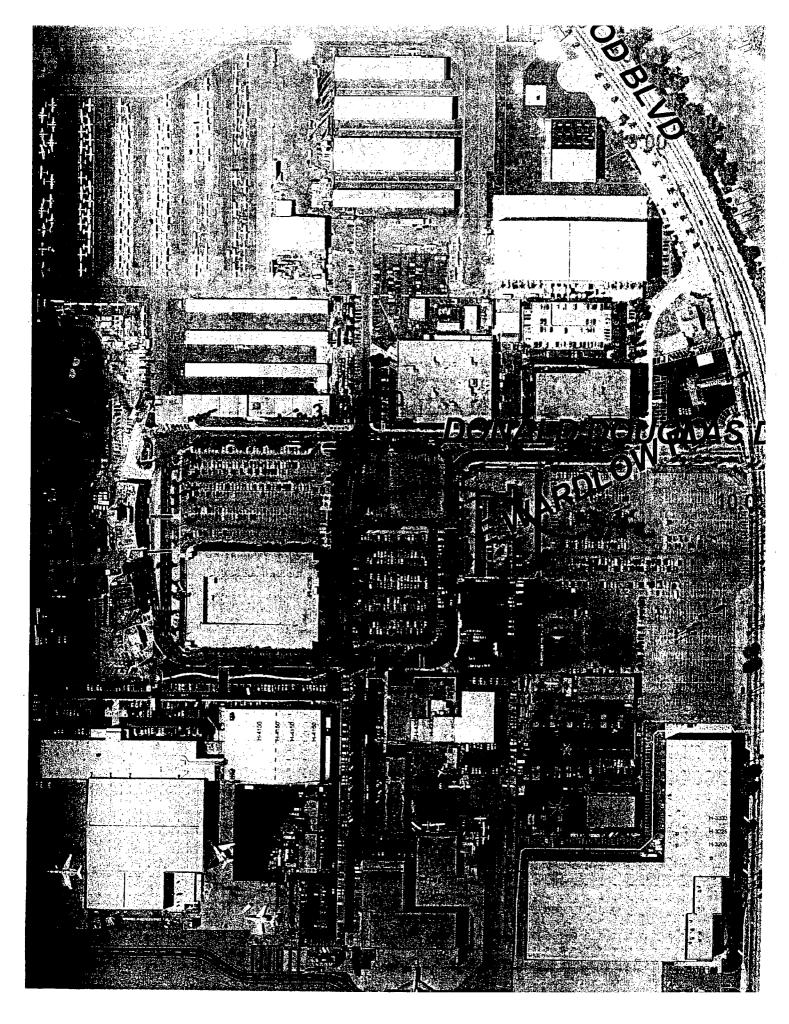

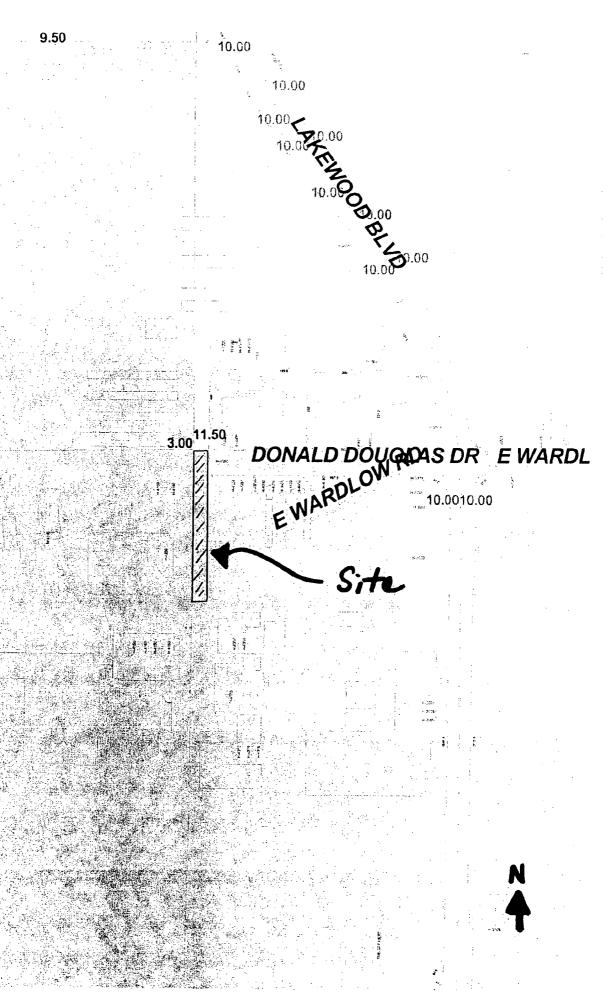
