AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING SECTION 6 OF ORDINANCE NO. C-7814 REGARDING THE TERMS AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE BELMONT SHORE PARKING AND BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT AREA ADVISORY COMMISSION

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 6 of Ordinance No. C-7814, adopted on August 6, 2002, is amended to read as follows:

Section 6.

- A. The Belmont Shore Parking and Business Improvement Area Advisory Commission is hereby established for the purpose of advising and making recommendations to the City Council regarding the utilization and expenditure of funds obtained pursuant to this Ordinance and any other funds obtained for parking uses in the Belmont Shore area. The Advisory Commission shall consist of seven (7) members who shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council, provided that each member so appointed shall, at the time of appointment and at all times during the appointee's term of office, meet all lawful qualifications for membership, including the following:
- 1. Three (3) members shall be owners of record of real property within the area described in Section 3.
- 2. Three (3) members shall be operators of a business within the area described in Section 3, at least two (2) of whom shall be

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members of the Board of Directors of the Belmont Shore Business Association, nominated by the Association, which, in making such nominations, shall observe to the greatest practicable degree the criteria for representative mix set forth in Subsection B of this Section 6.

- 3. One (1) member, designated as a "resident at large," shall be a resident of the Belmont Shore area appointed by the Mayor. For purposes of this "resident at large" position, Belmont Shore is defined to be (a) the area of the City of Long Beach bounded in general on the west by Termino Avenue, on the northwest by East Livingston Drive, on the northeast by East Broadway, on the east by Alamitos bay and 55th Place, and on the south by the Pacific Ocean and (b) that area of the City of Long Beach bounded in general on the west by 39th Place, on the north by Ocean Boulevard, on the east by Termino Avenue and on the south by the Pacific Ocean. A residence located on either side of a street named herein shall be considered to be within Belmont Shore.
- 4. No person whose sole business in the area described in Section 3 is the rental of residential or non-residential property as those terms are defined in Section 3.80.146 of the Long Beach Municipal Code shall be deemed an operator of a business for the purpose of this Subsection A.
- B. In appointing the membership of the Commission and subsequent vacancies in the membership of the Commission, the Mayor shall assure a representative mix of business interests and geographic locations including, but not limited to, (a) a representative mix of restaurant and retail interests (b) on both the north and south side of Second Street as well as (c) the easterly and westerly ends of the area.

C.

1. Should any vacancy occur in the Commission following 1

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initial appointment of membership, such vacancy shall be filled by an appointee meeting the same eligibility requirements applicable to the particular Commission member causing the vacancy to exist.

- 2. Should an appointed member of the Commission cease to meet all eligibility requirements at any time during the member's term, the Commission shall note such fact in the Commission minutes of the first meeting at which the Commission became aware of the cessation of eligibility, and the member's Commission seat shall thereupon be deemed vacated, and the Commission shall request the City Clerk to so notify the Mayor.
- D. No expenditure of any area funds or revenues shall take place without the prior approval of City Manager and the City Council.
- E. The term of office shall be two (2) years for each member. Members may be reappointed after their initial term, but in no event shall any person serve more than four (4) consecutive terms as a member. Serving any portion of an unexpired term shall not be counted as service of one (1) term. Members not eligible for reappointment may continue to serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. The terms shall terminate on the third (3rd) Tuesday of July of every even-numbered year.

Section 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor.
