

ORDINANCE NO. ORD-06-0053

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH EXTENDING THE TEMPORARY LIMITATION OF CERTAIN USED AUTOMOBILE SALES BUSINESSES ON LONG BEACH BOULEVARD BETWEEN WILLOW STREET AND ANAHEIM STREET; DECLARING THE URGENCY THEREOF; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

13 WHEREAS, Ordinance No. ORD-05-0040 was adopted on November 1. 2005, placing a temporary limitation on the construction or development of certain used 15 automobile sales businesses on Long Beach Boulevard between Willow Street and Anaheim Street: and 16

17 WHEREAS, Planning staff and the Planning Commission are continuing 18 to study potential amendments to the zoning regulations of the City related to used 19 automobile sales businesses on Long Beach Boulevard between Willow Street and 20 Anaheim Street.

21 Section 1. Purpose and Findings. At the direction of the City Council, the 22 Department of Planning and Building and the Planning Commission are currently 23 studying potential amendments to the Zoning Regulations of the City of Long Beach 24 relating to the proliferation of used automobile sales dealerships on Long Beach 25 Boulevard between Willow Street on the north and Anaheim Street on the south. 26 Concerned citizens and other individuals, have expressed that changes to existing 27 zoning regulations are desired and that continued development of used automobile 28 sales dealerships during the pendency of said studies may defeat the effectiveness of

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regulations ultimately adopted as a result of the current study and review. The City
Council specifically finds that the existing zoning and building regulations regulating
used automobile sales in the above described geographic area of the City permit one or
more uses, development standards, or construction activities which are, or may be, in
conflict with the zoning or building regulations that are or will be studied by the
Department of Planning and Building and the Planning Commission pursuant to the City
Council's direction.

8 Sec. 2. Estimated Time for Completion of Study. It is estimated that the
9 additional study or studies undertaken in connection with the adoption of this interim
10 ordinance shall take approximately one year to complete.

11 Sec. 3. Prohibition. No application for any land use entitlement, building 12 permit, construction permit, conditional use permit, administrative use permit, variance, 13 or business license of any kind, shall be approved, nor shall any such permit or entitlement be issued, for any activity that would result in the establishment of a used 14 15 automobile sales dealership business or similar operation on Long Beach Boulevard 16 between Willow Street and Anaheim Street prior to November 1, 2007, or the effective 17 date of an ordinance permanently adopting zoning or building regulations relating to the 18 aforementioned subject, adopted after the adoption of this ordinance, whichever occurs 19 first.

20 Sec. 4. <u>Declaration of Urgency</u>. This ordinance is an emergency 21 measure, and it is urgently required for the reason that, pending completion of the 22 necessary planning and zoning studies, and a determination relative to the potential 23 need to amend the Zoning regulations, it is necessary to limit construction or 24 development of used automobile sales dealerships, businesses or similar operations in 25 order to avoid the adverse impacts associated with operations that might be 26 inconsistent with the pending revisions to the zoning regulations of the City. 27 Sec. 5. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance duly adopted by the

28 City Council by a vote of five of its members and shall take effect immediately. The City

 this ordinance and to its passage by the vote of five members of the City Council of the
 City of Long Beach, and cause the same to be posted in three conspicuous places in
 the City of Long Beach.


This ordinance shall also be adopted by the City Council as a regular
ordinance, to the end that in the event of any defect or invalidity in connection with the
adoption of this ordinance as an emergency ordinance, the same shall, nevertheless,
be and become effective on the thirty-first day after it is approved by the Mayor. The
City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council of the City of
Long Beach and shall cause the same to be posted in three conspicuous places in the
City of Long Beach.
