H.R. 5101 Summary

The National Freight Network Trust Fund Act of 2014 would provide a long-term solution by creating a dedicated funding source to better serve our freight network at no new cost to a business or taxpayer.

The National Freight Network Trust Fund Act of 2014

- 1. Will create the National Freight Network Trust Fund.
 - This would be funded by directing 5% of all import duties already collected by Customs and Border Protection (CBP).
 - 5% of import duties would deposit approximately \$1.9 billion in the Trust Fund every year at our current rate of imports.
 - This dedicated funding source is at no new cost to business or individuals.
- 2. Would provide funding for:
 - The National Freight Network
 - Roads and rail lines that connect such network to a port
 - On-dock rail
 - Projects that appear in a State freight plan
 - Projects that appear in a regional transportation plan
 - High freight volume roadway or rail corridors that provide connectivity for:
 - o Ports
 - o Intermodal connectors
 - o Multimodal freight facilities
 - Multistate freight corridors
 - o International borders
 - o Airports
 - o Railway-highway grade separations.
