Stacy Mungo's proposal—to establish a clear and consistent city-wide policy regarding the planting, removal, and replacement of trees—is a pro-active response to neighborhood concerns.

We were quite distressed when we discovered at least eight trees were scheduled for removal during the Conant Street/Worst Streets construction. In attempting to get information regarding the removal and replacement of trees in the city, we encountered conflicting information and a passive approach toward maintaining tree canopies.

After 20 months and ten (10) phone calls to the city over the past two years, I have repeatedly asked the City to trim back and correctly shape the trees on my one block of Tulane from Harvey north to Centrailia streets. The other day they cut back only **one tree** near the corner of Tulane and Harvey. and yet (4) other trees are still overhanging so much they are also hazards to trucks and motorhomes. **It seemed ludicrous that the City Tree Service only cut one tree when there are so many that have not been attended to in 4-5 years, including the trees one block south from Village north to Harvey. There are also two trees from the corner of Tulane to Bellflower Boulevard.**

I also talked to the Manager of the Street Service a year ago and advised him of the terrible street condition of Harvey Street between Bellflower to Clark. Also the Clark Street between Centrailia north to Del Amo has several paths that are maintenance minefields to our cars. Nothing has been done about these two major thoroughfare.

I cannot believe how badly the upscale neighborhood of the Village has been neglected in the 21 years My wife and I have lived here. We feel like we must leave this neighborhood and move out of state since our tax dollars are being neglected here in Long Beach and California.

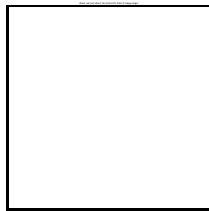

At this upcoming City Council Meeting on [April 20th](#) I ask you to join me in support of two important items that I'm presenting to help streamline our City services and maintain two key features of our City: 1) Our urban tree canopy and 2) Our parks, and the roads and parking lots that serve as vital access points to these treasured spaces.

Since the start of the pandemic, and especially this last Easter Sunday, residents continue to use our parks and outdoor spaces in record numbers. Everyday of the week, while walking around with my daughter, I continue to see families and neighbors enjoying the fresh air, and using our parks and sidewalks for safe gathering, exercise and play.

So many neighbors love and utilize our parks and get benefit and enjoy the beauty of our parkway trees. This is why I'm asking our City Management team to find a better way to make use of current City resources that:

1. Ensures the preservation of our urban tree canopy by combining a patchwork of tree programs into a Citywide Tree Replacement Program —[see Item 10](#); and
2. Streamlines road repair and pothole requests in our parks with City-service reporting tools (like [Go Long Beach](#)) —[see Item 11](#).

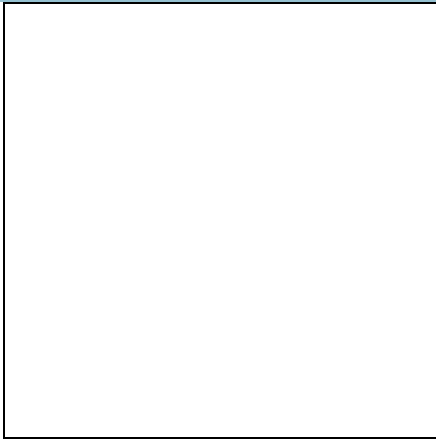
This is a policy issue about which department is best equipped to address these things in a holistic manner. Once a department has ownership, I will work with that department to grow the funding for these projects. It really makes no sense to have two or three different departments doing the same thing in different ways, presenting residents with too many mediocre options instead of a simple cohesive process. We must do better—for our neighborhoods and for our residents.

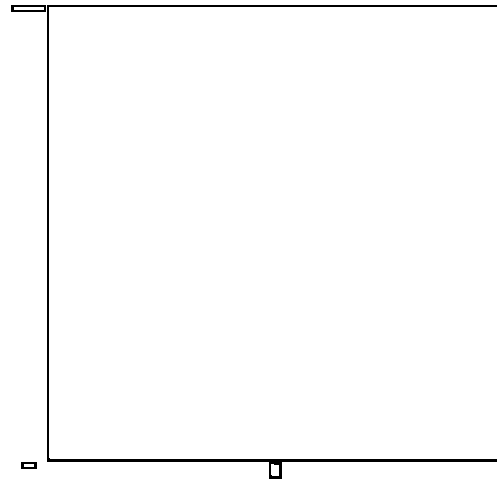

U.S. MARINE CORPS TRAINING AT LGB

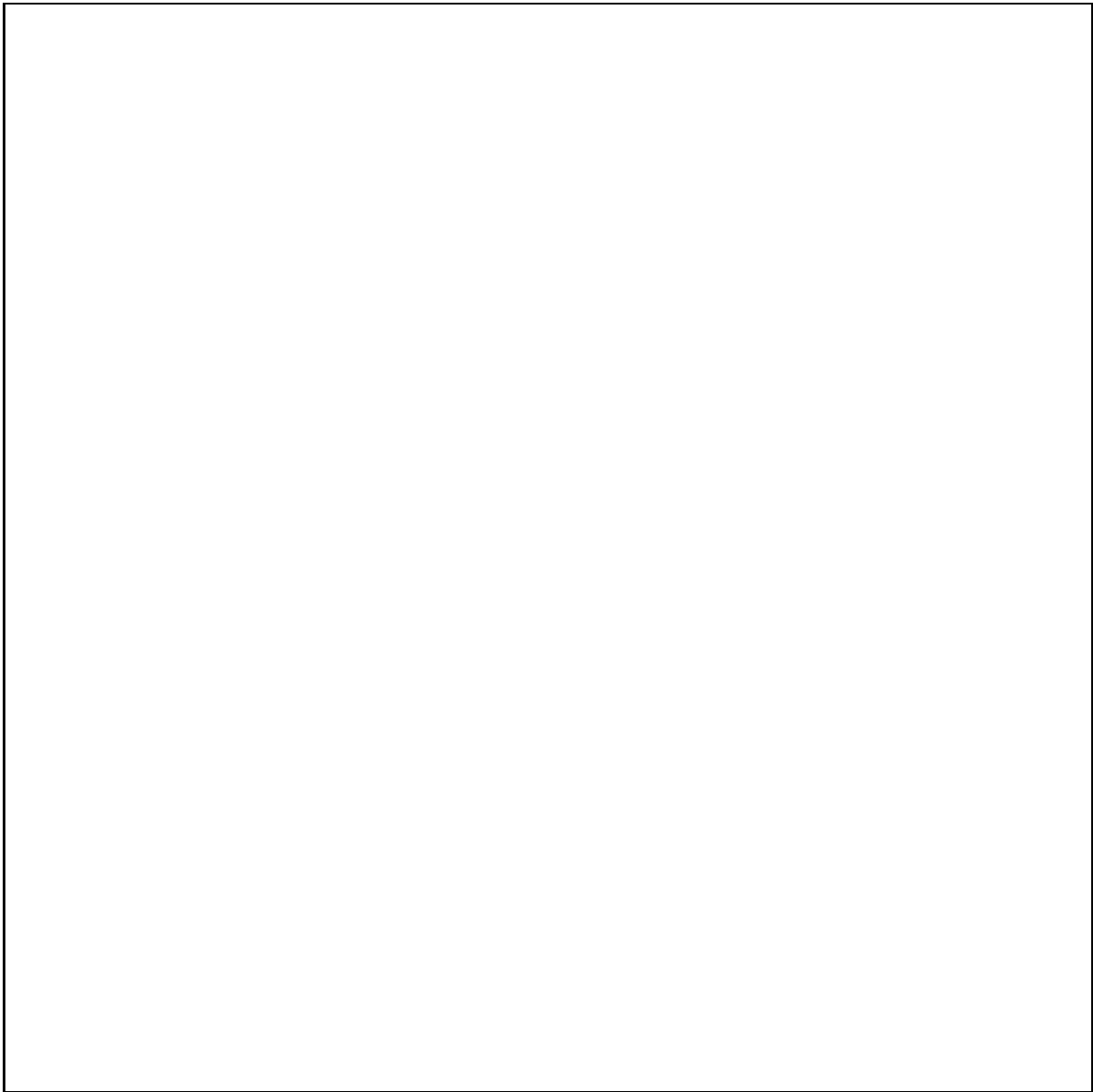
The U.S. Marine Corps will be conducting training operations at [Long Beach Airport](#) from **Friday, April 16-19** with two F/A-18 aircrafts. It is anticipated that these aircrafts will arrive late in the morning on Friday and conduct a few training operations on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday prior to departing late in the morning on Monday, April 19. All times are tentative and subject to change.

As a reminder, these aircrafts are exempt from our [noise regulations](#); however, the military has demonstrated a desire to assist in being a good neighbor. They have also been very responsive to community concerns within their missions and safety of flight constraints. The aircraft will use noise abatement procedures when operating in the vicinity of Long Beach. These procedures include modified arrival and departure flight profiles and minimum use of afterburners.
