I-710 Funding FACT SHEET

I-710 Environmental Impact Report (EIR)/Environmental Impact Study (EIS)

Seven agencies are contributing to the \$30 million EIR/EIS study of the I-710 Corridor. MTA, Gateway Cities Council of Governments, Port of Long Beach, Port of Los Angeles and Caltrans each committed \$5 million; and SCAG and the I-5 Joint Powers Authority have committed to \$3 million and \$2 million respectively. The study will begin in early 2007, and is expected to be completed in early 2010.

I-710 Southern Terminus Project

The City has been awarded federal transportation funds in the amount of \$2.4 million through SAFETEA-LU for the final design and preliminary engineering of the I-710 southern terminus project. The funded project will reconfigure the Shoemaker Bridge south to Golden Avenue, realigning the on- and off-ramps between Broadway and 7th Street, which will almost double the grounds of Cesar Chavez Park.
