## **RESOLUTION NO.**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF WOMEN'S EQUALITY DAY ON AUGUST 26, 2015, COMMEMORATING THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

WHEREAS, in 1971, Congress passed a Joint Resolution declaring August 26 of each year Women's Equality Day; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the 95th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment, extending the right to vote to women; and

WHEREAS, this courageous campaign, which formally began with the first women's rights convention at Seneca Falls, New York, in 1848, spanned seventy-two (72) years and was carried out by tens of thousands of persistent women and men; and

WHEREAS, the women's suffrage amendment was introduced for the first time in Congress on January 10, 1878 and was re-submitted numerous times until finally receiving approval from both the United States House of Representative and the Senate in June 1919; and

WHEREAS, by a one-vote margin, the State of Tennessee approved the amendment in August 1920, providing the final vote needed for ratification; and

WHEREAS, the amendment officially became law on August 26, 1920;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as

follows:

Section 1. This City Council hereby declares its support of Women's Equality Day on August 26, 2015, commemorating the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution.
