"We understand that in these trying times we all need to come together as a community and help those in need. As longstanding merchants and business owners in the city of Long Beach we appreciate our patrons and customers and are eager to work with our community to help those in need throughout this holiday season."

Christian Outreach in Action (COA) is a non-profit, non-denominational, multi-cultural, compassionate organization that follows faith-based teachings to break the cycle of poverty and homelessness in the Long Beach community. COA's mission is to teach the disadvantaged the skills necessary to reach and sustain self-sufficiency, and to prevent homelessness. COA's primary goal is to break the cycle of poverty and homelessness by assisting homeless and low-income people regain stability and self-sufficiency. "We have seen a 40% increase in requests for food from our facility in the last year," explains Dixie Dohrman, Executive Director of COA. "We are seeing a dramatic increase in requests for groceries from families that have jobs and are paying rent but do not have money left at the end of the day to purchase food. We are finding that the needs in all areas are increasing but the funding and donations are decreasing so food drives such as the one that Marketplace Long Beach is hosting are critical to us being able to serve our community."



fed and clothed me when I had nothing. They helped me pick myself up, to start again. They restored my faith and gave me the priceless gift of hope.

Every day, hundreds of individuals experience the gift of hope through the ministry of Christian Outreach in Action. Whether it's providing a hot meal to an elderly man, a warm jacket to a homeless child, bus tokens to a young man trying to get to a job interview or helping a single mom go back to school — COA is about reaching out to those in need, right in our own community.

Located in a former church in the East Village of downtown Long Beach, COA is on the front-line of providing critical services to the growing number of men, women and children in this city who are battling homelessness, poverty, hunger and addiction.

Through its core programs (as described in this brochure) COA provides a beacon of light, a safe haven, where each individual is treated with compassion, dignity and respect. It is a place where the love of God is demonstrated every day and where lives are transformed forever.

You have no idea the simple blessing of eating a hot meal.

Crisis Assistance Program — COA provides a life-line to individuals and families in the Long Beach area who are struggling to survive in a city that ranks 10th in the nation for the number of individuals living at or below the poverty level. Because of its location downtown, COA is a first-response for many, providing critical services to those in need.

The COA Crisis Assistance Program includes:

Meals - breakfast and dinner are served Monday through Friday, along with lunch on the first, third and fifth

Food Pantry - groceries are available to clients twice a week, including staples, toiletries and vitamins.

Clothing & Household Items - clean, gently used clothing items are available at no charge, as well as donated household items and furniture.

Bus Tokens - transportation is provided to doctors' appointments, job interviews and to other agencies for assistance.

Gunshots, drug deals, gangs, violence - it was all around me and I'd just keep walking, praying that I would make it safely to morning.

Men's Transitional Housing — COA works with a core of clients through the Men's Transitional Housing program to address the causes of homelessness and to find long-term solutions. Housed in a dormitory-style setting, the facility has capacity for 8 men at any given time.

Participants are assigned a case manager and mentor and they are expected not only to attend 12-step meetings, but to live out the principles. The residents work at COA, helping with facility maintenance and assisting with the daily meal service:

Beyond learning life-skills, the men experience what it is like to be treated with dignity and respect. They learn self-esteem and have the opportunity to begin anew as productive caring citizens.

I was surrounded by people who believed in me. They taught me and my children to claim the words, 'I can,' for the very first time.

Women's Traditional Housing — To lift a child out of poverty, you must start with the parent and that is what the COA Women's Transitional Housing program does. This unique program for single mothers involves intense case-management, addressing the issues of homelessness, addiction and abuse.

Participants live with their children in a sate, 12-unit building owned and operated by COA. They learn both life and parenting skills, Emphasis is placed on work and education. In fact, all of the women are in school — not just completing their GED but pursuing their college degree.

The Transition Housing program helps women and their children have faith in themselves and in God. They learn what it means to be successful in life —


