Two of the more common neuromuscular diseases include Duchenne muscular dystrophy, a disease found in children that progresses slowly with survival rare beyond the late twenties, and Lou Gehrig's Disease, a disorder that progresses rapidly in adult clients that is also known as amyotrophic lateral sclerosis; and

Whereas, The Muscular Dystrophy Association is a voluntary health agency that was created in 1950 by a driven group of parents whose children suffered from a form of muscular dystrophy. Seventy-five percent of every dollar raised by MDA goes directly to research, health care services and education. Each year, MDA holds a national telethon to raise funds to serve clients. Last year, the telethon raised more than 4 million in Southern California and 54.9 million nationally; and
