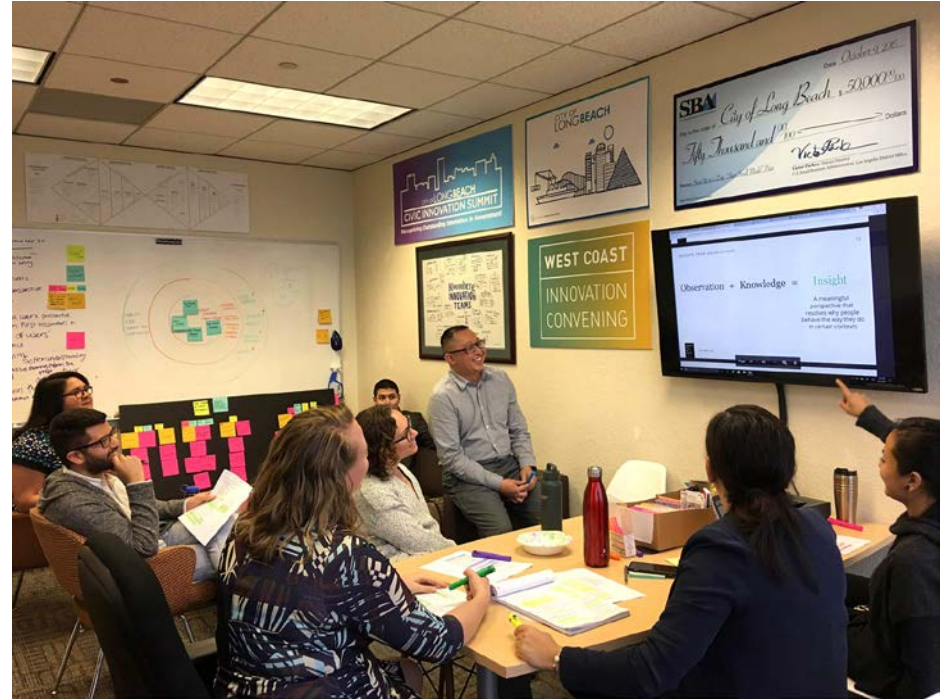

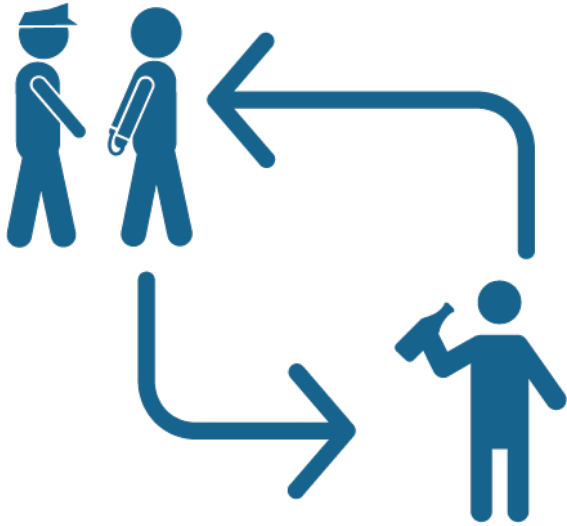

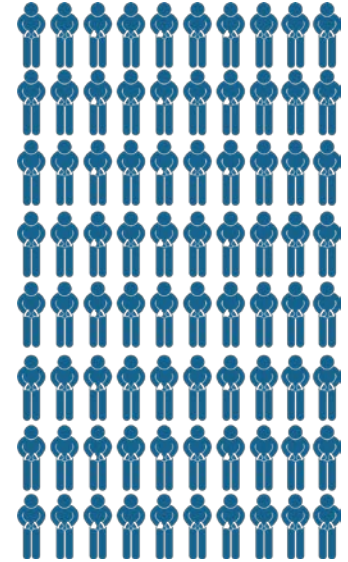

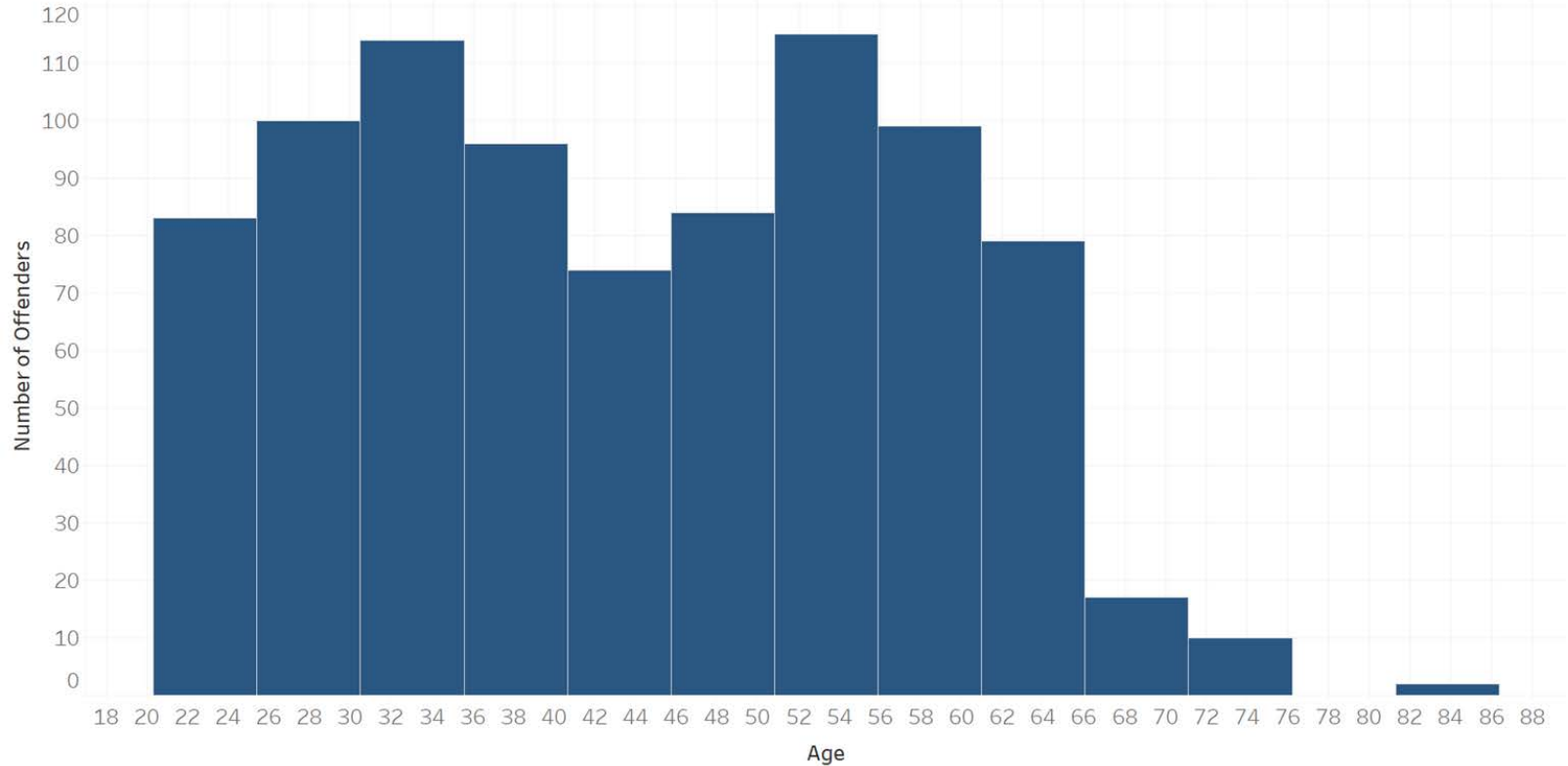

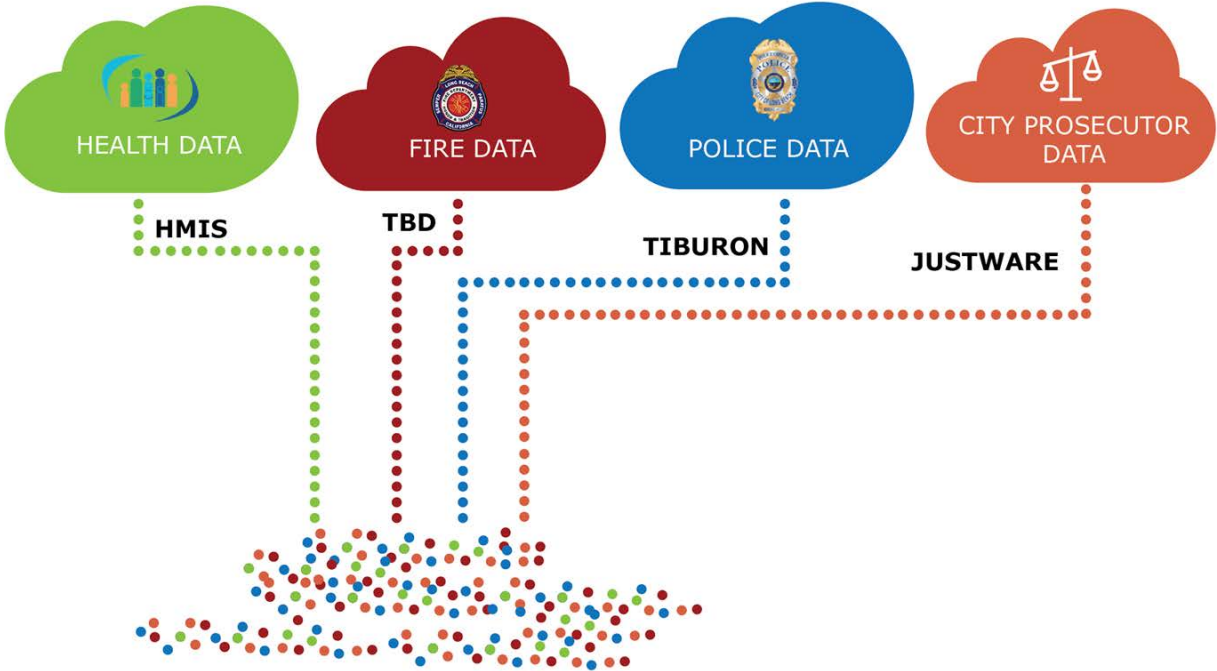


“I would have paraphernalia tickets that would turn to warrants and I never would comply.”

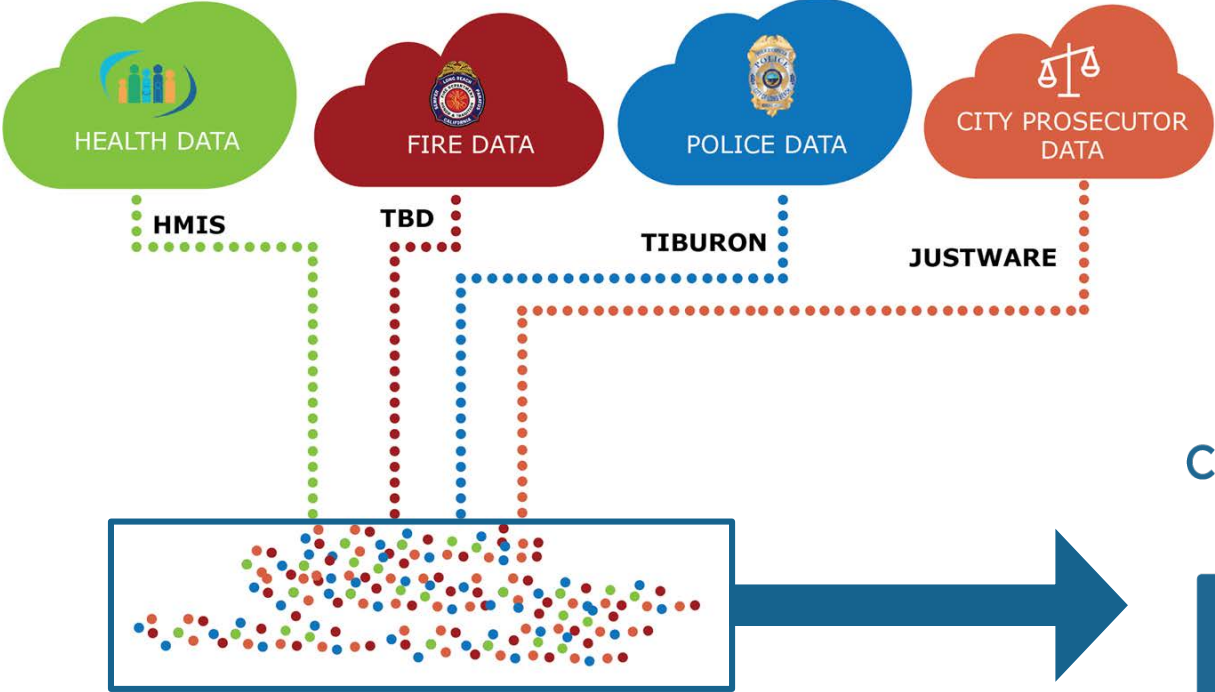
“He [the Police Officer] would sometimes take me to jail [. . .] I would curse and scream. I would play this game with him and say that I’m already on my way to the program and he’d say, ‘I know, I’m going to make sure that you go down there,’ and then he’d take me to jail.”

“He has a job to do, you can’t fault him for doing his job. I would say to myself, ‘he always showed me respect.’ I appreciated that, because at that time I had depression, I was already eating myself up.”

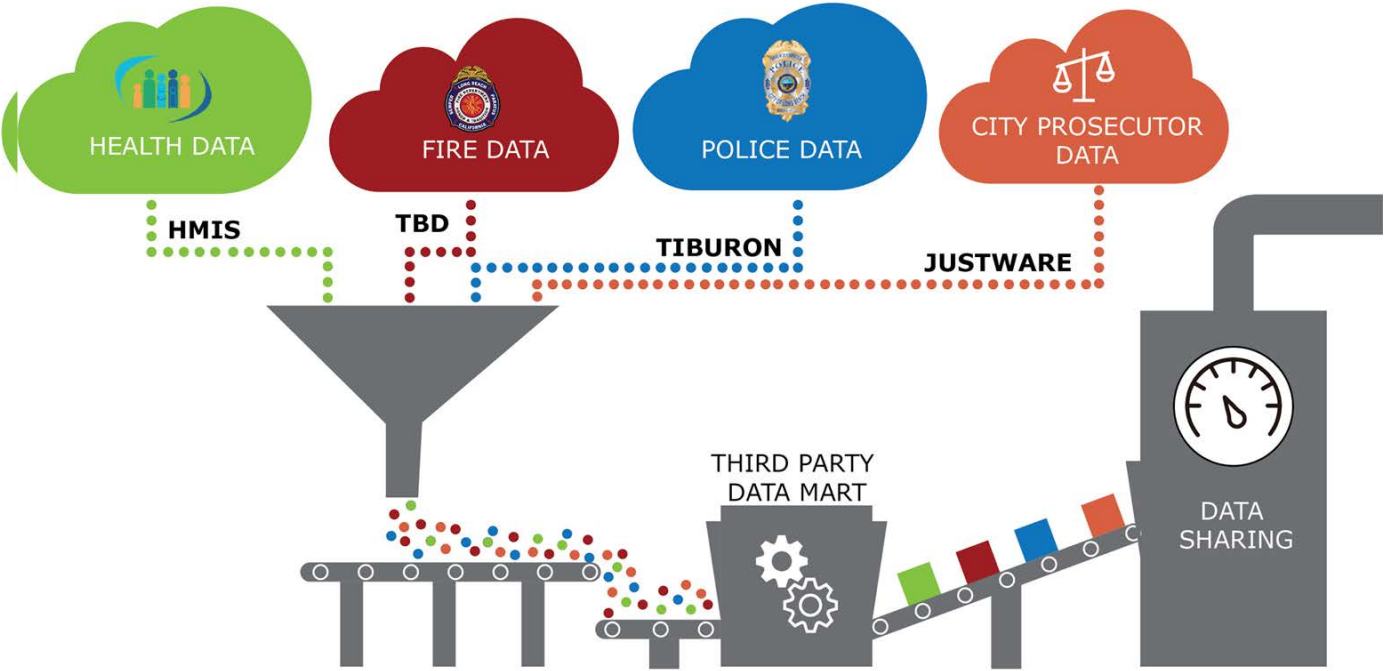
