

Each year throughout the United States, fireworks cause:

- 18,500 fires
- 3 deaths
- 11,900 injuries
- Children 15 account for 35% of injuries



Block Parties

- Office of Special Events and Filming coordinates all requests
- Organizers must sign a permit, which states
 - Block Parties must end at 7:00 p.m.
 - All fireworks are illegal
 - Block Party participants will comply with all applicable laws
- Fire Department representatives visit all Block Parties and speak about illegality and dangers of all fireworks
- Block Party permits will be revoked if illegal activity occurs

Enforcement

- Fourth of July is busiest day of year for Police and Fire
- All Officers are assigned to work

2017 Statistics:

- Communications Center handled over 3,000 calls on July 4
- Issued 46 fireworks citations
- Seized over 7,000 pounds of illegal fireworks



Enforcement

- July 1 through July 5 enhanced Police Patrols and two additional Fire Arson Patrols
- Respond to reports of illegal fireworks activity throughout City, focusing on areas with historically high activity
- Officers need to witness a person "in the act" in order to issue a citation
- Citations are often confrontational



Drop-off Locations

- Fireworks may be voluntarily disposed of at collection bins throughout the City
 - All Fire Stations
 - All Police Stations
 - Lifeguard Headquarters
