Available Admin Fee Fund Balance includes a July 2004 City Council approved Non-General Fund (Rental Rehabilitation Program) loan of \$2,900,000 to the Housing Authority from a HUD grant through the City's Housing Services Bureau. Excluding these funds, the unreserved admin fee operating reserve at 12/31/13 is \$2,788,050. There is a net loss for the current year in the amount of (\$266,683), which includes a decrease in HAP funding in the amount of (\$401,553). This decrease in HAP funds plus prior year HAP reserves of \$2,520,648 are reserved for future HAP payments and may be subject to recapture. The net HAP restricted fund balance at 12/31/13 is \$2,119,095, of which \$1,798,006 is restricted for the HCV program and \$321,089 is restricted for the VASH program. It is HUD's policy that the Housing Authority may use the restricted HAP reserves to pay for any excess HAP expenses over and above the amount of HAP subsidy received from HUD. The current fiscal year administrative fee net income is \$134,870, which is calculated by subtracting administrative expenses from the total administrative fees earned by HUD.
