HONORABLE HOUSING AUTHORITY COMMISSION City of Long Beach California

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt the attached resolution authorizing Darnisa S. Tyler, Deputy Executive Director, to apply to the City of Los Angeles for Housing Opportunities for Persons with Aids (HOPWA) funds and to execute all documents necessary to accept funds and implement the HOPWA program. (Citywide)

### **DISCUSSION**

The City of Long Beach Housing Authority has been providing housing and supportive services to low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS, with funding provided by the City Los Angeles Housing Department (LAHD), since 1999. Working with our partners at the Long Beach Health Department and with the St. Mary's Hospital Care Program, the programs has been successful in preventing homelessness with low-income families dealing with AIDS. The existing contract with LAHD will expire September 30, 2011.

On July 11, 2011, the LAHD released a new Request for Proposal to provide housing and supportive services to low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS. Services solicited for this RFP, which the City of Long Beach Housing Authority plans to respond to, include supporting services, specifically housing specialists services, for HOPWA clients in emergency, transitional or permanent housing situations. These housing specialists services will focus on assisting HOPWA clients and their families to locate and secure appropriate and affordable housing, and to follow-up with households after receiving housing or other services (through other agencies for benefits, mental health, substance abuse and legal counseling), to assess housing stability, and to provide assistance and referrals, as needed, to help the household maintain their housing.

The initial term is six months, to begin October 1, 2011, with an option to renew for two one-year periods. Approximately \$1.4 million is available for supportive services for the initial six-month contract, which will be distributed among several LA County agencies responding to this RFP.

Currently, the City of Long Beach Housing Authority is providing some of these supporting services to its HOPWA clients with two case managers through an existing contract with LAHD. However, LAHD decided to expand its overall HOPWA services, including the supportive services offered to the HOPWA clients, and therefore, LAHD issued the RFP.

This letter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Linda Trang and Budget and Performance Management Officer Victoria Bell on July 21, 2011.

## **TIMING CONSIDERATIONS**

The City of Long Beach Housing Authority Commission's action is requested on August 2, 2011, as the RFP procedures require this recommended action by the Commission in order for the Housing Authority to respond to the RFP. The deadline for RFP submittal is August 5, 2011.

# **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no fiscal impact to the General Fund, as the funds to pay for the case managers will be paid by LAHD through HUD funding.

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority desires to enter into negotiations with the City of Los Angeles for Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funds made available through a Request for Proposals; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority desires to identify the individual authorized to negotiate on behalf of the Housing Authority and to sign all legal documents in conjunction with such proposal and the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, City of Los Angeles grant fund application procedures require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of HOPWA funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Housing Authority of the City of Long Beach, California, resolves as follows:

Section 1. That the Housing Authority is hereby authorized to apply to and enter into negotiations with the City of Los Angeles for HOPWA funds.

Section 2. That Darnisa S. Tyler, Deputy Executive Director of the Housing Authority, is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Housing Authority to negotiate and execute any and all instruments which are necessary to complete the proposal and subsequent contract(s) in conjunction with such proposal.
