JUDGES & EMCEE



JEWLL MASSEY - HEAD JUDGE

Jewell Massey retired from teaching in 1996 due to post polio syndrome and recently returned to Knoxville, Tennessee after teaching high school biology in Florida and elementary gifted in Georgia. Currently, she is remolding a1930's bungalow and reinventing herself as a raised bed gardener.

Shortly before polio vaccine was discovered, Jewell was diagnosed with the acute paralytic polio and could only move the fingers on her left hand. At 13, a counselor at Camp Easter Seal had suggested college and changed the course of Jewell's life. Graduations followed from Lincoln Memorial University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology, Mercer University with a Masters degree in Biology, the University of Georgia with an Ed.S. in behavior disorders, and Macon College with an Associate degree in criminal justice.

Jewell served as Ms. Wheelchair Georgia in 1988 and Ms. Wheelchair America 1989. She has been an advocate for many years in various capacities: peer supporter at Shepherd Spinal Center in Atlanta, First International Conference on the Church and Disability, Project Smile, Camp Phoenix for children with burns, child abuse, National Association for Mental Illness, Council of Exceptional Children, Diabetes Association, American Heart Association, American Arthritis Association, MDA volunteer for several years, committee for fundraising for AIDS Center, Para Olympics torch bearer, polio post child, Shriner's poster child, mito-chondrial diseases, Cerebral Palsy, and Alzheimer's. She was a Pilot Clubs Georgia Professional Woman of the Year, Gifted Teacher of the Year in Macon, served on the Georgia Governor's Council on Employment of Persons with Disabilities, Executive Director of Macon Mayor's Council on Employment of People with Disabilities, Macon Council's Citizen of the Year, 1990 Census Committee, and others.

She would tell you that there have been many "encouragers" along the way and folks who believed in her before she was strong enough to believe in herself. Somehow, there were always bridges from one phase to the next level of adventure. There were honors and achievements and titles, but the biggest honor was the one allowing her to accompany her Mother as a 24/7 caregiver on her Alzheimer's Journey.



DAVID KORSE, JUDGE

David has been working in the F2F (Face-to-face) Events (exhibitions, conferences, special events) industry for 30 years. He has held senior management positions with a number of international exhibition organizing companies and he has been responsible for launching, managing and growing over 300 events in North America, Europe and Asia.

Since 2008 he and his business partner Lewis Shomer have been the owners and managers of the Abilities Expo series of events for the disability community held around the United States.



LLOYD UPDIKE, JUDGE

Women Who Make a Difference. She received the Changing Images in America Award for her advocacy in the entertainment field as well as a Tri-Union (Screen Actors Guild, American Federation of Television and Radio Artist and Actor's Equity) Diversity Award in 2004. During the 1990's Gail and her husband Tommie took their 6 nieces into their home after the deaths of Gail's brother and sister-inlaw. The girls joined the Williamson's two sons. The youngest son Blair, born with Down syndrome was already a professional actor with some nice credits to his name. Gail's experience with Blair's career made her even more passionate about creating more diverse characters with disabilities in the entertainment industry.



SHARINA JONES, JUDGE

Michigan native, Sharina Jones was a shooting victim when she was just five years old. This event left her unable to walk for the rest of her life. More importantly, however, it was the beginning of the unveiling of Sharina's purpose in life; to inspire others to reach their greatest potential. Even from such an early age, Sharina was aware that she was to overcome her tragedy by not focusing on herself, but to move forward to help those around her. With the help and guidance of her family, friends, medical personnel and others, Sharina was able to adjust to her circumstances, pushing past huge obstacles and limitations, and perform her life's mission.

After graduating high school she continued her education and attended Mott Community College, earning an Associate's degree; the first in her family to attend college. She continued her education and earned a Bachelor of Science degree at Oakland University, and an MBA from

Wayne State University in 2008.

Ms. Wheelchair America 2012. She established the nonprofit organization, Think Beyond the Chair, and also started the motivational clothing and accessories company Push Goddess, LLC. Her first book, Life of a Push Goddess, is one of her favorite accomplishments. She is currently writing her second book, Not All Goddesses Are Alike. Sharina was crowned Ms. Wheelchair Michigan in 2011, 1st But when asked, it is her marriage to Grover Jones in May of 2010 that brings Sharina the most joy. The loving couple resides in Michigan, where they enjoy all that life has to offer.

He didn't have the right curves to be a showgirl so decided to study comedy instead, and began getting laughs at the ripe old age of 5 with his now infamous bunny fart routine. Marchand is a classically trained actor who has studied theatre at the University of Nevada Las Vegas and improv with the Upright Citizens Brigade LA. Russ, a skilled live event host has been the go-to host for Disney for years. He has hosted events with Miley Cyrus, Selena Gomez, Tyra Banks and many others (not to mention Mickey Mouse). Ms. Wheelchair America promotes her chosen platform in a variety of settings. She serves as a positive role model for the next generation of Americans with disabilities inspiring them to leave their own legacy. Her commitment and personal example to serve to further the mission of Ms. Wheelchair America, Inc.

The pageant is made up of multitude of activities. This allows the judging panel time with the state titleholders, while enabling the competitors an opportunity to share with each other and develop friendships. The titleholders become stronger advocates throughout the week because of the variety of interesting workshops that strengthen them. These workshops develop skills that heighten awareness on issues within the community and open a dialogue between the women and their thoughts, ideas, values, and experiences.

The Ms. Wheelchair America, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) non-profit that is staffed and coordinated totally by volunteers from many different organizations, businesses, private citizens, and previous titleholders. It is through the monetary and in-kind support of the many sponsors that the national titleholder is able to fulfill her duties throughout the year and travel across the country with her message of empowerment for people with disabilities. The Ms. Wheelchair America Program is actively seeking sponsors and volunteers and would appreciate any support that is offered.






