RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the application for the fifteenth cycle of the Used Motor Oil Block Grant and Implementation, authorize the City Manager or designee to accept the grant funds and execute all documents necessary to implement the purposes of the grant. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

The California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) provides block grants to local jurisdictions to promote the collection and recycling of used motor oil and used motor oil filters. This will be the City's fifteenth Used Motor Oil Block Grant (Grant). The CIWMB requires a resolution of the City Council authorizing the grant application. The attached resolution also authorizes the City Manager, or designee, to execute all necessary documents to carry out the purposes of the grant.

The State of California allocates funds to each jurisdiction annually, but due to the continuing financial crisis in California, funds have been reduced approximately 40 percent from previous years, which will be reflected in the amount granted to the City. The fifteenth cycle Grant amounts are awarded on a per capita basis from a fund of about \$6 million. The grant period runs from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2012.

The City uses these funds to promote used oil recycling by offering curbside motor oil collection, as well as utilizing various advertising and media outlets such as newspaper advertisements, brochures, refuse truck signs and unique marketing materials distributed at Citywide events. This year, grant activities will continue to support these same efforts.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Amy R. Burton on July 16, 2009, and by Budget and Performance Management Bureau Manager David Wodynski on July 15, 2009.

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TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on August 4, 2009, in order to submit the grant application to CIWMB before the August 31, 2009, deadline.

FISCAL IMPACT

Previously, the City of Long Beach has received grant funding of approximately \$132,000 per cycle. Due to California's budget crisis, a reduced grant amount of approximately \$76,000 will be provided to the City to continue motor oil recycling activities this year. The exact amount will not be known until September 2009. This amount will be deposited in the Refuse/Recycling Fund (EF 330) in the Department of Public Works (PW). Matching funds are not required.

8 WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have enacted the
9 California Oil Recycling Enhancement Act that provides funds to cities and counties for
10 establishing and maintaining local used oil collection programs that encourage recycling
11 or appropriate disposal of used oil; and

12 WHEREAS, the California Integrated Waste Management Board has been
13 delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program within the state, setting
14 up necessary procedures governing application by cities and counties under the program;
15 and

16 WHEREAS, if awarded block grant funds, the applicant will enter into an
17 agreement with the State of California for further implementation of a used oil collection
18 program;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
20 follows:

21 Section 1. The City Council authorizes the submittal of an application to
22 the California Integrated Waste Management Board for a 2009/2010 Used Oil Recycling
23 Block Grant. The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized and empowered to
24 execute in the name of the City of Long Beach all necessary applications, contracts,
25 agreements, amendments and documents of any kind hereto for the purposes of
26 securing block grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the
27 grant application.

28 Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
