



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Parklets Accidents

Good evening Mayor and Council members. I am Jeff Miller, a resident of Belmont Shore.

I am here this evening to alert you to the dangers of parklets in Belmont Shore, and ask that a proper analysis of the risks be made before any permanent parklets are approved there. There have been two parklets destroyed by cars on Second Street and one downtown, but thankfully no one was killed and only one person was injured. You can see these crashes in the photos I have presented to you.

I made a simple search online, to learn how parklets around California and the US have fared since their installations. In many towns and cities, both small and large, there have been shocking examples of vehicles crashing into them. I found graphic photos and videos of damaged and destroyed parklets. In the small sample I have documented, there were multiple injuries and deaths caused by these collisions. Twenty of these crashes occurred in other cities in California, and 21 more happened around the US. Total: 76 injuries and 6 deaths. I have included the list in your packet.

It is evident that parklets are inherently dangerous - a distracted or inebriated driver, moving by with twelve inches of clearance, with only a small mistake in steering, at even a low speed, can easily and instantly cause a tragedy. A wooden or plastic barrier, even if weighted down with water, is no match for a two-ton sedan, let alone a large SUV or delivery truck. A Fedex or Amazon truck can weigh more than 5 tons!

There are already more than a dozen applications for permanent parklets on Second Street. If a terrible crash causes injuries or deaths, who will be held responsible? The vehicle driver? Quite likely. But you can be sure the city will be named in a lawsuit, stating the obvious fact: a parklet so close to traffic was a known hazard, and should not have been permitted.

Long Beach is currently without a Traffic Engineer, due to tragic circumstances, and it seems prudent for the City to delay allowing permanent parklets on Second Street until the City has hired a new Traffic Engineer - one with a specialty in accident prevention. A current study must be conducted of the Second Street conditions - more than 30,000 vehicles traverse our Business District every day. In addition we have bicycles, scooters and skateboarders, pedestrian congestion and severely limited parking to deal with. In less than a month, a new Third District Council member will be elected, who should also be consulted.

The only reasonable conclusion will be that no parklets should be permitted in Belmont Shore.
