HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute all necessary documents and amendments between the State of California Department of Health Care Services and the City of Long Beach for the continued provision of Targeted Case Management Services to eligible Medi-Cal beneficiaries for a period of five years, July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2018, for an estimated annual revenue of \$185,000. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION:

Since 1997, the City of Long Beach Department of Health and Human Services (Health Department), has been providing Targeted Case Management (TCM) services to eligible Medi-Cal beneficiaries. Under this agreement with the State of California Department of Health Care Services (State), Health Department staff assist eligible clients in accessing critical medical services.

This year, over 800 individuals received TCM case management services from the Health Department. The beneficiaries are mostly children, and medically fragile individuals. TCM provides critical case management services to individuals with significant health needs.

On September 18, 2012, the City Council approved the most recent TCM Provider Participation Agreement (PPA) which extended the contract for one year, ending on June 30, 2013. The proposed agreement will allow the Health Department to continue to claim reimbursement for the provision of TCM services. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2018.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney, Linda Vu on May 16, 2013 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on May 21, 2013.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action on this matter is requested on June 11, 2013 to ensure timely billing and revenue capture.

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FISCAL IMPACT

The Health Department will receive reimbursement from the State based on the number of qualified TCM encounters provided to eligible Medi-Cal clients. While the agreement does not specify a dollar amount, annual reimbursement of \$185,000 is estimated and budgeted in the Health Fund (SR 130) and in the Department of Health and Human Services (HE). Subsequent budgets will be appropriated as part of the annual budget process. All anticipated costs will be offset by reimbursements from the State of California Department of Health Care Services. There is no local job impact associated with the recommendation.
