RESOLUTION NO. RES-22-0121

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH COMMUNITY PARTNERS WITHOUT ADVERTISING FOR BIDS TO DEVELOP AND PILOT THE EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION ENROLLMENT HUB PROGRAM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$600,000 FOR A PERIOD OF EIGHTEEN MONTHS

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2021, the Long Beach City Council approved the Long Beach Recovery Act (LB Recovery Act), a COVID-19 recovery program to support City programs in three main categories - Economic Recovery, Healthy and Safe Community, and Securing Our City's Future; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Heathy and Safe Community category of the LB Recovery Act, the City's Department of Health and Human Services seeks a consultant to create and implement the Early Childhood Education Enrollment Hub Program ("ECE Hub"), a digital early childhood enrollment hub for community members and early childhood education providers to streamline enrollment for early childhood education programs into a single online platform; and

WHEREAS, in addition to creating the technology component of the ECE Hub, the City's consultant will be responsible for coordination efforts among the City's early childhood education providers including the Long Beach Unified School District (LBUSD), marketing efforts to promote the ECE Hub, as well as the distribution of early childhood education tuition assistance for those in need; and

WHEREAS, as a local nonprofit whose mission is to ensure all students have access to educational pathways, the Mayor's Fund for Education is the only nonprofit

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provider that can effectively coordinate the development of the ECE Hub based on the Mayor's Fund for Education's existing relationships and position of trust with the bulk of childcare providers in the community, knowledge of available early childhood education funding streams, understanding of the data components for the ECE Hub platform and the school identifiers, working partnership with LBUSD, and potential to fulfill the City's longterm goal of providing an in-person and phone resource for early childhood education enrollment services; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Fund for Education, an unincorporated nonprofit, will be working with Community Partners, a registered 501(c)3 nonprofit as the fiscal agent of the Mayor's Fund for Education, to provide the structure, finance and accounting services, and administrative support to ensure the success of the ECE Hub creation; and

WHEREAS, as a result, no useful purpose would be served by advertising for bids and to do so would constitute an idle and useless act and an unnecessary expenditure of public funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein.

Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Community Partners as fiscal agent for the Mayor's Fund for Education to develop and pilot the ECE Hub Program in an amount not to exceed Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) for a period of eighteen (18) months.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
