#### RECOMMENDATION:

Determine that the granting of Facility/Pipeline Permit Supplement No. S-3-05, under existing Facility/Pipeline Permit No. P-11-50, to the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, will not be contrary to the public interest, and authorize the City Manager to issue said permit supplement in accordance with Section 15.44.060, Permit-Issuance, of the Long Beach Municipal Code, for the installation of communications conduits for the Los Angeles County Alamitos Seawater Barrier Telemetry System. (District 3)

### **DISCUSSION**

The County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works (County) has filed an application for Facility/Pipeline Permit Supplement No. S-3-05, under existing Facility/Pipeline Permit No. P-11-50, to install 1,647 feet of 2-inch PVC communications conduits for the County's Alamitos Seawater Barrier Telemetry System. These communications conduits will allow the County to remotely monitor underground water conditions and levels through existing observation wells and allow the operation of existing injection wells. The system will enable the County to more efficiently use water injection to keep seawater away from the underground drinking water supply.

The conduit will begin in Silvera Avenue just south of 7<sup>th</sup> Street, then go southerly to 6<sup>th</sup> Street, then westerly in 6<sup>th</sup> Street to end at a point west of Margo Avenue. The route of the proposed conduits is shown on the attached vicinity map.

The Department of Public Works has reviewed the application and found the proposed conduits to be compatible with existing installations and not an obstacle to any street use or any known proposed developments. Traffic control requirements stipulated by the Traffic and Transportation Bureau will be made a part of the special conditions for the excavation permit. The County, because it is a governmental agency, is not required by the Long Beach Municipal Code to file a bond or public liability insurance for this permit supplement.

In conformance with the California Environmental Quality Act, a statutory exemption for this installation was filed with the County Clerk. This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney J. Charles Parkin on October 9, 2005.
