75 years ago on March 10, 1933 at 5:54 pm a 6.4 magnitude earthquake struck Long Beach causing millions of dollars in damage and unfortunately took the lives of 120 people.

Currently the city does have an overall plan set in case of another emergency, but the realities are:

- 911 dispatch would be overwhelmed
- Only 133 firefighters on duty at any given time
- 3 out of 7 LB police officers live outside the city
- Only 1 out of 30 people are prepared to sustain themselves for the critical 7 days following a major disaster

**Cracks exist in our overall preparedness!
What else could be done?**

President Bush recently addressed local emergency coordination by challenging “cities and counties cross the country to... [bring] together first responders, volunteer organizations, law enforcement agencies, and community-serving institutions such as schools, hospitals... and houses of worship”.

Houses of worship can play a critical part of a successful and proactive plan of caring for our city's wellbeing!

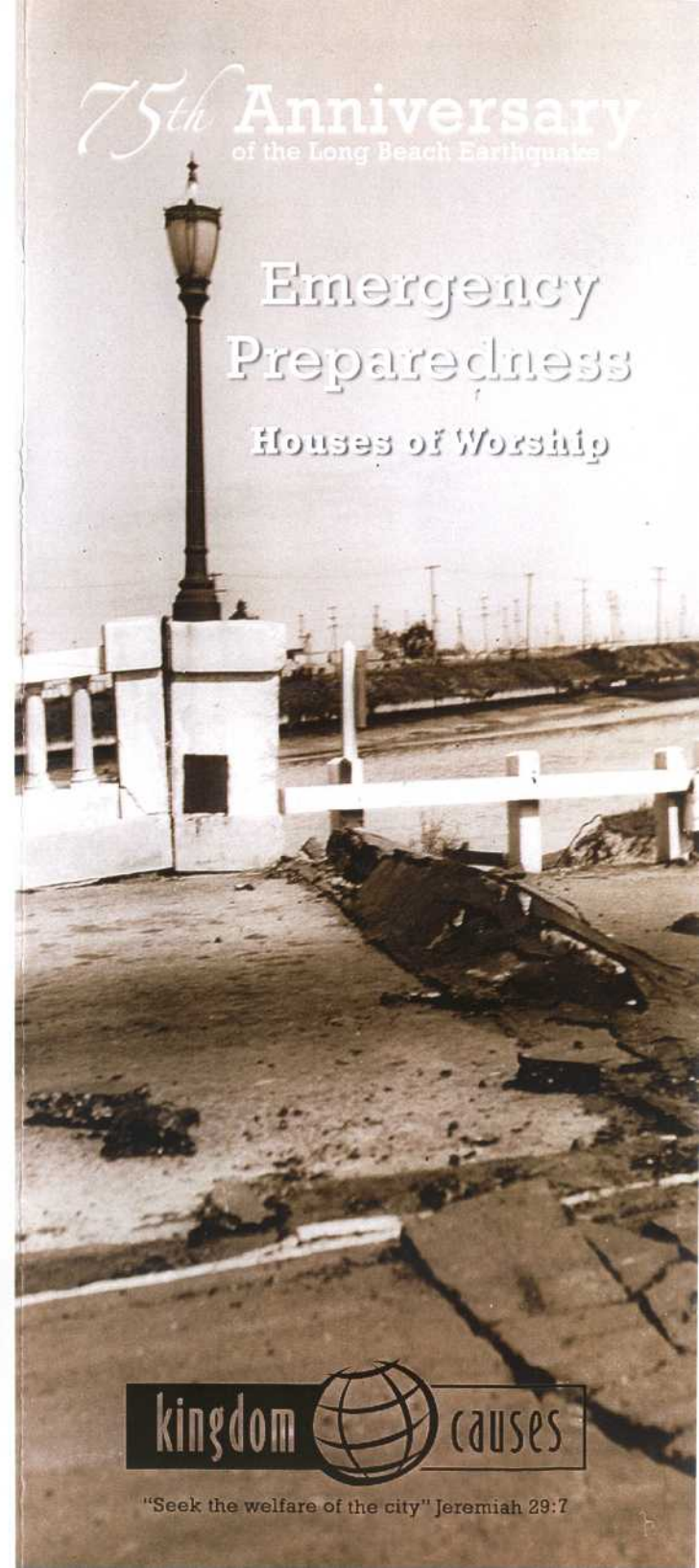

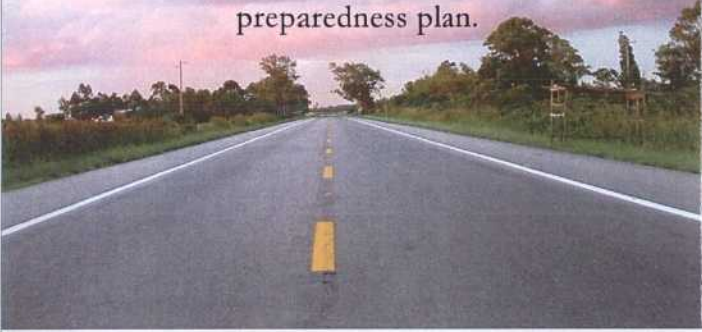

The City of Long Beach is proud to be working with the faith-based community to better prepare for any major emergency or disaster. It is clear that the limited resources of the City of Long Beach cannot do it alone. It takes coordination and a strong commitment between the City and volunteers, like you, to make a positive impact. Working with Kingdom Causes has and will make a difference.

The Plan

Our worship center enrollment plan starts with a breakdown of the city into 24 Emergency Preparedness Zones (EP Zones). Within each of these EP Zones, we are committed to systematically identifying and leveraging the influence and resources of various local worship centers. Once identified, each worship center will be assigned a designated Area of Responsibility (AOR). These local worship centers, when equipped and trained, will be able to serve their neighbors in some very tangible and important ways by functioning as hubs of information and care as they foster a local sense of security and preparedness.

There is room for everyone to get involved! What role will you play?

Level 4 City Designated Resource Center

- Specifically designated city resource (ex: Red Cross Shelter, Ham Radio Station, etc)
- Triage Center/Staging Area in case of a local or citywide emergency

Level 3 Emergency Response Center

- Primary information and referral center for designated EP Zone
- Represent their EP Zone at various citywide meetings (including KC EP Task Force)
- Represent their EP Zone at local neighborhood meetings (ex: Neighborhood Watch, Associations, etc)

Level 2 Neighborhood Resource/Training Center

- CERT certified team identified for their AOR
- Willing to host neighborhood trainings in AOR
- Committed to ongoing local neighborhood resource assessment (Asset Mapping)

Level 1 Neighborhood Advocate

- Identified team to go door-to-door in their designated area when needed
- Worship center congregants informed, prepared, and mobilized

THE 1933 LONG BEACH EARTHQUAKE

75TH ANNIVERSARY



At 5:54 p.m. on March 10, 1933 Southern California experienced its deadliest seismic disaster in recorded history when a magnitude 6.4 earthquake struck Long Beach and surrounding areas. The quake occurred along the Newport-Inglewood fault zone. Seismic records suggest a maximum slip along the fault of about 1 meter, with a total rupture length of roughly 15 kilometers. The actual rupture lasted only 5 seconds, though ground shaking lasted at least twice as long. The earthquake killed over 120 people and caused property losses estimated at \$50 million (1933) dollars.
