Resolution for National Child Abuse Prevention Month

RECOMMENDATION

Request to adopt a resolution supporting April as National Child Abuse Prevention Month.

DISCUSSION

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan declared April National Child Abuse Prevention Month. Violence in the family has the greatest impact on children ages zero to five since they cannot speak for themselves. These children often suffer from lifelong adverse health, social, and economic consequences.

The City of Long Beach offers a wide variety of services and programs through our various departments, including our Health Department. Additionally, various programs exist from efforts by community members, school officials, and nonprofit agencies to comprehensively address violence. Finally, the City is nearing completion of a Violence Prevention Plan, which recognizes that the long-term costs of childhood abuse can be mitigated through early identification and intervention.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no significant fiscal impact for this resolution.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF LONG BEACH RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF
APRIL AS NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION
MONTH

WHEREAS, since 1983, by Presidential decree, April has been recognized as National Child Abuse Prevention Month; and

WHEREAS, exposure to violence in the family has the greatest impact on children, ages 0-5, who cannot speak for themselves; and

WHEREAS, children who grow up with family violence and/or neglect have serious lifelong adverse health, social, and economic consequences including:

- Behavioral problems;
- Mental health conditions such as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder;
- Increased risk for delinquency;
- Adult criminality and violent behavior;
- Lasting impacts or disability from physical injury;
- Reduced health-related quality of life;
- Low levels of adult economic wellbeing; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach operates services and programs to address violence in the family, in schools, and in the community, and is currently engaged in a community-wide effort to develop a comprehensive violence prevention plan that acknowledges a progression of violence that begins in the home during childhood and may then manifest itself in juvenile delinquency and develop into a lifetime of crime as an adult; and

WHEREAS, exposure to violence during the first five years of a child's life has staggering societal costs over children's lifetimes, including burdens on our city's

social service, law enforcement, juvenile justice, criminal justice and education systems; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach recognizes that these societal costs can be mitigated through early identification and intervention, and the provision of specialized services, evidence-based treatment and long-term care and support; and

WHEREAS, the Long Beach Child Abuse and Neglect Network (LB CANN), supported by First 5 LA Best Start, is a collaborative of volunteer community parents. residents, and service providers, focusing on reducing violence in homes with children ages 0-5;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Long Beach City Council hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. The City of Long Beach proclaims the month of April as Child Abuse Prevention Month in the City of Long Beach.

Section 2. The City of Long Beach is committed to creating a community where children are healthy, safe, and have the resources necessary to develop into successful students, productive workers, responsible family members, and citizens.

Section 3. The City of Long Beach confirms its commitment to the national goals of safety for children, prevention of child abuse, neglect and domestic violence exposure and promotion of the social and emotional wellbeing of children in families and communities.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
